## **COVID-19 Funding Overview**

- As a result of the coronavirus pandemic, unprecedented levels of funding have been allocated to response and recovery:
  - Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES) -\$2.2
    Trillion
    - \$150 billion Coronavirus Relief Fund for direct payments to States and Local governments
    - \$45.4 billion allocated to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for response and recovery
    - **\$25 billion** in emergency direct assistance to transit agencies to compensate for lost revenue
    - 12 billion allocated to the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) specifically for housing and homeless programs.
    - **\$10 billion** in funds to be awarded as economic relief to eligible U.S. airports distributed according to allocation formulas
    - \$\$850 million allocated to the Department of Justice supporting grants for the purposes of preventing, preparing for, and responding to the Coronavirus

#### **FEMA Public Assistance**

- Eligible uses under Category B "Emergency Protective Measures" include:
  - Management, control and reduction of immediate threats to public health and safety
  - Emergency medical care
  - Medical sheltering
  - Purchase/distribution of supplies, including personal protective equipment for direct response activities
  - Communications of general health and safety information to the public
- Eligible period of performance: January 20, 2020 TBD
- Reimbursement capped at 75%

## Coronavirus Relief Fund (El Paso County)

The CARES Act requires that the payments from the Coronavirus Relief Fund only be used to cover expenses that—

- 1. are necessary due to the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19);
- 2. were not accounted for in the budget most recently approved as of March 27, 2020 (the date of enactment of the CARES Act) for the State or government; and
- 3. were incurred during the period that begins on March 1, 2020, and ends on December 30, 2020.

CARES Airport Program grant funds may be used for any purpose for which airport revenues may lawfully be used, following the FAA's Policy and Procedures Concerning the Use of Airport Revenues.

# FTA CARES Act Apportionment – Section 5307 (FTA)

- Expenditure deadline: March 31, 2026
