- Non-emergency encompasses calls received to our 719 444-7000 line, alarm line, administrative line and all other internal lines into the communications center.


### **ANSWER CALL TIMES**

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## DEFINITION OF CSPD PRIORITIES



**Priority 1** - represents an imminent life-threatening situation that requires an immediate response by police, fire, and/or medical personnel. These calls are generally in progress or events that just occurred.

Examples include:

- Active Shooter
- Assault in progress
- Home Invasion Burglary
- Missing or Found Child
- Physical Domestic Disturbance
- Kidnapping
- Shooting
- Stabbing

# DEFINITION OF CSPD PRIORITIES



**Priority 2 -** represents critical situations and includes in-progress calls with potentially dangerous circumstances, but no apparent imminent life threat. These calls are generally in progress or just occurred events.

Examples include:

- Abuse/Abandonment/Neglect
- Missing or Found Adult
- Burglary In Progress
- Verbal Domestic Disturbance
- Suicidal Person
- Traffic Accident Injury or Unknown

# DEFINITION OF CSPD PRIORITIES



**Priority 3** - represents in-progress incidents involving property and cold incidents against a person. These calls can be in progress, just occurred, a past event, or a cold call.

Examples include:

- Cold Assault
- Burglar Alarm
- Damage in Progress
- Harassment
- Motor Vehicle Theft In Progress
- Suspicious Circumstances
- Traffic Accident Non-Injury
- Theft In Progress

## ALTERNATIVE REPORTING OPTIONS



- Direct Line Reporting (DLR): Specified call types and incidents are received and documented via telephone.
- Internet Crime Reporting (ICR): Specified call types and incidents are documented online by the citizen or CSPD member and received via the Internet.
- Lobby Reports (LR): Allows citizens to go to a police substation to report crimes with or without viable suspect information in person.

# **CLASSIFICATION CHANGES**



- Created a new level of Emergency Response Technician to allow for development.
- Created a new level of Public Safety Dispatcher to allow for development.
- Authorized roughly 15 employees to be moved between the levels to better fit their tenure, skills and experience (advancement).
- Authorized a post-training pay increase to incentivize new Emergency Response Technicians to complete training.
  - All ERT's are brought in at minimum, after training they receive a 5% increase.

# **TRAINING REQUIREMENTS**



### **ERT Training**

- 6 weeks of classroom training
- 9 weeks of OJT minimum (average student is closer to 12 weeks)
- Total time for independence on ERT position = 4.5 months

### **PSD** Training

- Completion of ERT Training 4.5 months
- 1 week classroom training for Police Radio Procedures
- 9 weeks OJT
- 1 month for time to work independent on Police
- 3 days classroom training for Fire Radio Procedures
- 2 weeks OJT minimum
- Total time for independence on PSD position = approx. 9 months
