AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE COLORADO SPRINGS HUMAN RELATIONS COMMISSION

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Colorado Springs has identified Quality of Life as a Strategic Prioritized Goal; and

WHEREAS, "Quality of Life" is an all inclusive term that includes economic prosperity, an affordable home, gainful employment, clean air and water, quality healthcare, safe and attractive neighborhoods and working environments, ample educational and recreational opportunities, convenient transportation systems, and an active and diverse community which is rich in art and cultural amenities; and

WHEREAS, equal rights and equal opportunity, acceptance and respect for diversity and discouraging discrimination in any form is essential to fostering a sense of community and establishing the type of Quality of Life to which the City aspires; and

WHEREAS, City Council finds it to be in the best interests of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens to create an Human Relations Commission.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLORADO SPRINGS:

Section 1. Establishment Purpose.

A. There is hereby created the Colorado Springs Human Relations Commission (the "Commission") for the purpose of providing voluntary

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mediation ond conciliation services, community outreach, communications programs and, when requested, recommending resolution of matters relating to equal rights and equal opportunity for people in employment, housing, public accommodations, education, services and other cancerns that moy affect the social well-being of the community.

B. The Cammissian will promote acceptance and respect tor diversity through educational pragrams, and discouroge oil torms at discrimination including, but nat limited to, discrimination on the basis at race, creed, economic condition, ethnicity, color, religion, national origin, sex, age, sexual arientation, gender identification, gender expression, marital ar tamilial status, military or veteran status, political atfiliation, socioeconomic class, resident or public assistance status, arganizational membership or physical or mental disability.

C. When requested, the Commission will use its best efforts to resolve community canflicts and tensions, and may act as a reterral resource in these and related matters as appropriate. To this end, the Commission moy:

1. Consult or confer with public otticials, private individuols and arganizatians when requested.

2. Render assistance, advice and informed advocacy to agencies af local government, cammunity groups and individuals when requested.

3. Provide education and communications regarding civil and human rights.

4. Provide information, referral, guidance and voluntary mediation and conciliation services to aggrieved individuals.

D. The Commission shall not have any regulatory authority ar enforcement powers.

E. The Commission shall be advisory in nature and shall submit regular meeting minutes and activity reports to the City Council.

Section 2. The Citizens' Commission shall consist of nine (9) regular members, representing a crass-section of the community. Commission members shall be appointed for up to two (2) consecutive three (3) year terms. Each member of the initial Commissian sholl serve at least one term and shall be appointed to ane, two (2) and three (3) year terms so os to achieve staggered appointments. City Council may oppoint alternotes to the Cammission in accord with City Code § 1.2.902. Regulor ond oiternote members of the Commission shaii serve of the discretian of City Council. A simple mojority of regular appointed members shail constitute o quorum.

Section 3. Commission members ond aiternotes, when octing within the scope of their oppointments, shoii comply with the provisions of City Charter §§ 9-i0 and 3-60(d), the City Cade, the Rules and Procedures of City Council, ond the Colorodo Open Recards Act, C.R.S. § 24-72-201, et seq.

Section 4. The Commission shall meet of times ond locotions convenient to the Commission ond to the public.

Section 5. In occord with City Code § i.2.903, the Commission moy, with City Cauncil opprovol, promulgate rules of procedure tor its organization and the conduct at its meetings. The Commission rules at procedure moy include provisions regarding: the election and responsibilities at a chair and vice-chair; colling of special meetings; the order at business; preparation, opproval and distribution at agendos and minutes; and vating methads.

Section 6. This ordinance shall be in tull torce and ettect trom ond otter

its possage and publication as provided by Charter.

Section 7. Council deems it oppropriate that this ordinance be published by title and summary prepared by the City Clerk and that this ardinance shall be available tor inspection and acquisition in the attice of the

City Clerk.

ORDINANCE NO. 12-20

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 10-48 PERTAINING TO THE COLORADO SPRINGS HUMAN RELATIONS COMMISSION

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLORADO SPRINGS:

Section 1. Ordinance No. 10-48 is amended as follows:

Section 1. Establishment Purpose.

A. There is hereby created the Colorado Springs Human Relations Commission (the "Commission") for the purpose of providing a referral resource to members of the community; developing and promoting voluntary mediation and conciliation services, community outreach, communications programs, and, when requested, recommending resolution of matters programs and forums relating to diversity issues, equal rights and equal opportunity for people in employment, housing, public accommodations, education, services and other concerns that may affect the social well-being of the community; assisting in resolution of conflicts regarding human relations issues, including neighborhood disputes, through dialogue, facilitation, forums and other means; and making recommendations to City Council regarding matters of social importance to the community.

* * *

C. In addition to the powers set forth above, wWhen requested by City Council, the Commission will use its best efforts to resolve community conflicts and tensions, and may act as a referral resource or sounding board in these and related matters as appropriate. To this end, the Commission may:

1. Consult or confer with public officials, private individuals or organizations-when requested. and

2. Rrender assistance, advice and informed advocacy to agencies of local government, community groups and individuals as City Council directswhen requested.

3. Provide education and communications regarding civil and human rights.

4. Provide information, referral, guidance and voluntary mediation and conciliation services to aggrieved individuals.
