





Housing Preservation with CDBG



- ➤ Brothers Redevelopment assisted 32 extremely low income and 27 very low-income households with essential repairs and accessibility improvements.
- ➤ In partnership with Colorado Springs Housing Authority, CDBG funds benefited 66 extremely-low income households.
