

ORDINANCE NO. 14-_____

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE 1
(ADMINISTRATION AND ENFORCEMENT) OF CHAPTER 10
(MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC) OF THE CODE OF THE
CITY OF COLORADO SPRINGS 2001, AS AMENDED,
PERTAINING TO THE DEFINITION OF A TRAILER AND
TOWING OF THE SAME

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
COLORADO SPRINGS:

Section 1. Article 1 (Administration and Enforcement) of Chapter 10
(Motor Vehicles and Traffic) of the Code of the City of Colorado Springs 2001, as
amended, is amended as follows:

Chapter 10 Motor Vehicles and Traffic
Article 1 Administration and Enforcement
Part 2 Definitions

Section:

10.1.202 – Definitions:

* * *

TRAILER: Any wheeled vehicle, without motive power, ~~having an empty weight of more than two thousand (2,000) pounds, which~~ **that** is designed to be drawn by a motor vehicle and to carry its cargo load wholly upon its own structure and which is generally and commonly used to carry and transport property over the public highways.

Chapter 10 Motor Vehicles and Traffic
Article 25 Removal and Impoundment of Vehicles

Section:

10.25.101 – Authority to Impound Vehicles

D. A vehicle, **or trailer**, is left parked in the same place upon a street, highway or alley continuously for a period of seventy two (72) hours, or when any vehicle is left parked upon a street fronting on a business zone area continuously for a period of twenty four (24) hours or more.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its final adoption and publication as provided by charter.

Section 3. Council deems it appropriate that this ordinance be published by title and summary prepared by the City Clerk and that this ordinance shall be available for inspection and acquisition in the office of the City Clerk.
