## **Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)**

Decent housing, quality neighborhoods, and economic opportunities

## **HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME)**

Housing development, acquisition and rehabilitation, and tenant-based rental assistance

## **Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG)**

Homelessness services and prevention

**MUST BENEFIT LOW-INCOME POPULATIONS**






# COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT PROCESS



- Four public hearings (including 2 before drafting the plan, one in Spanish)
- 27+ consultations with stakeholder organizations
- 30-day public comment period Dec. 27-Jan. 27
- Community Development Advisory Committee review and approval
- Two online surveys (community and stakeholders)
- Presentation to City Council at Work Session on January 27, 2025
- Request for City Council approval March 25, 2025

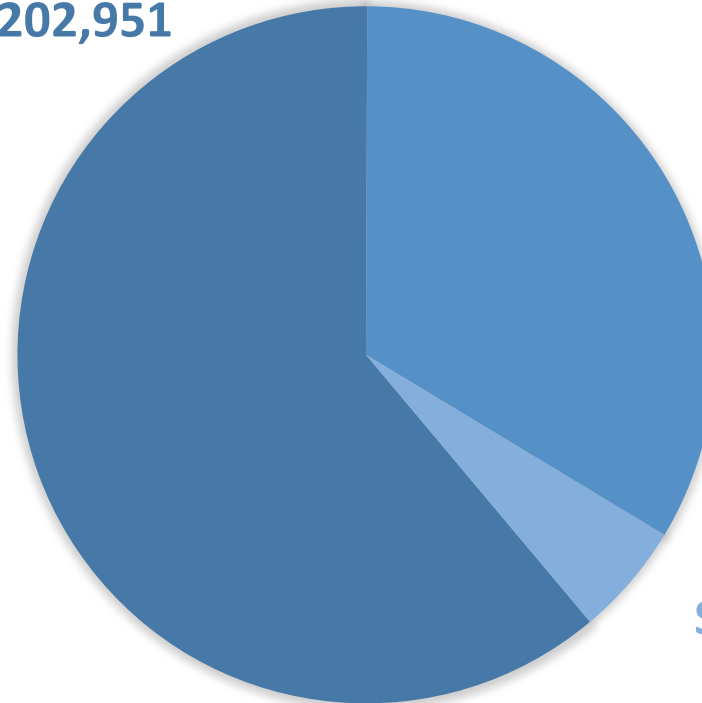

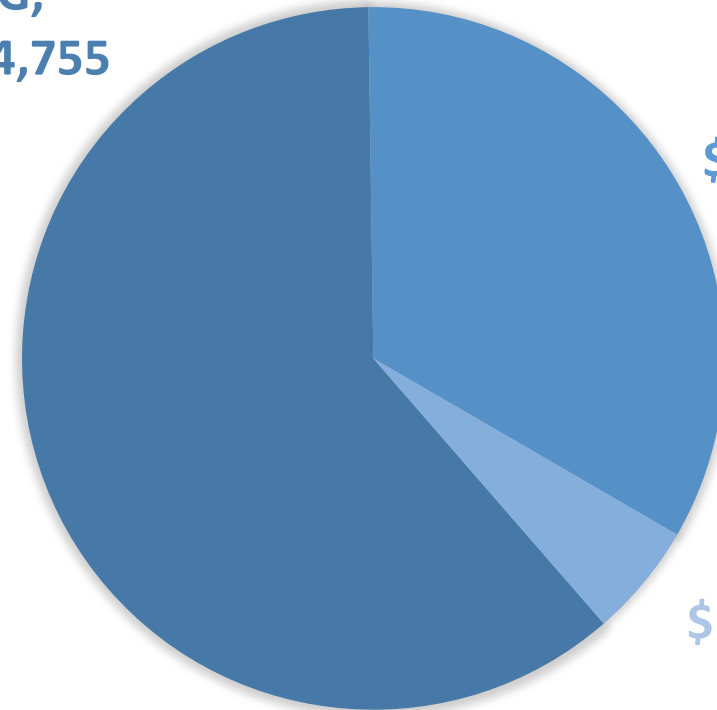

## Emergency Solutions (ESG)

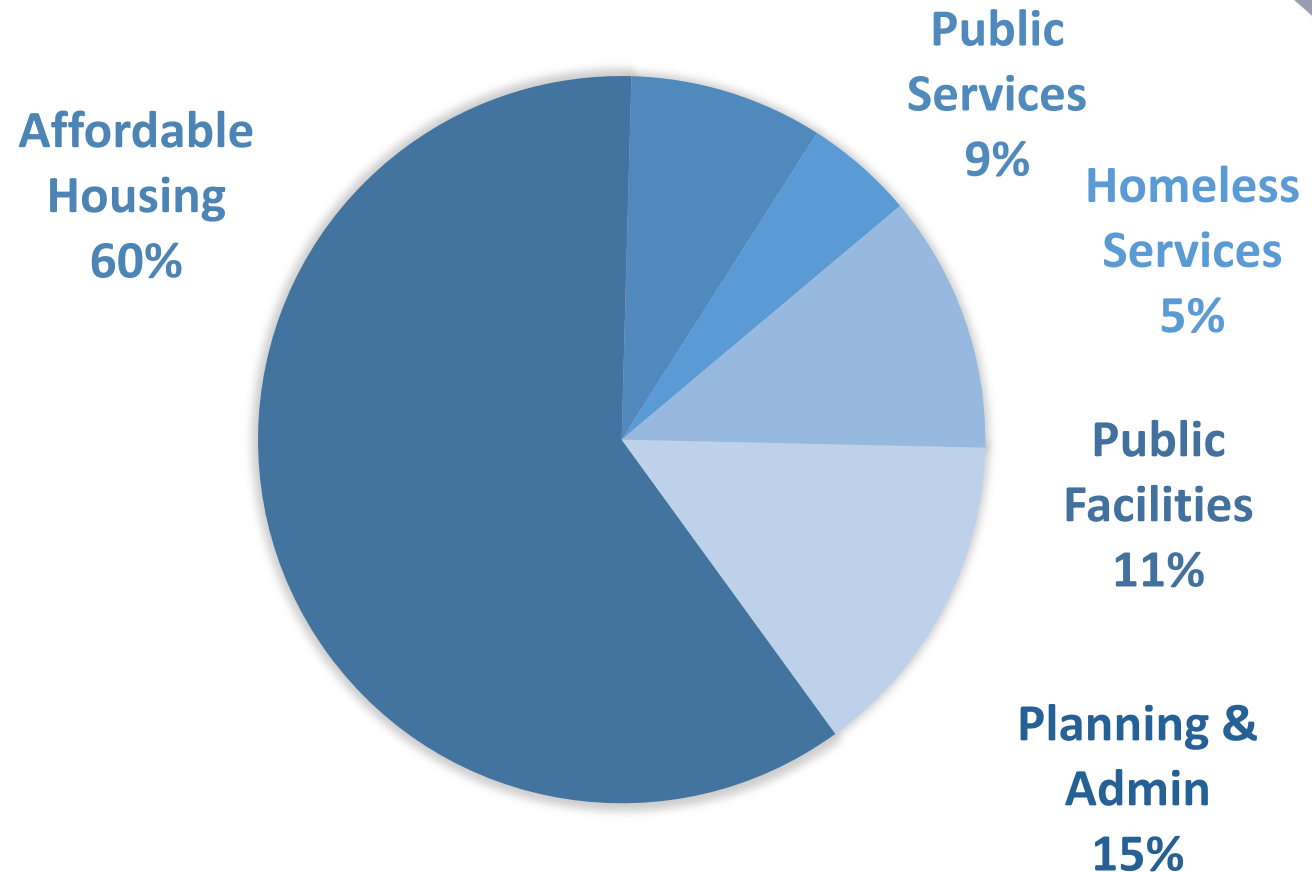
\$254,114 (5%)

# NEXT STEPS



- Request City Council approval
- Receive final notification of award
  - If award is reduced, will implement pro rata reductions across priority areas
  - If reductions are significant enough to require elimination of a priority activity, will come back to City Council
- Submit to HUD – 45 days for approval
- Program year begins April 1, 2025

# CITIZEN PARTICIPATION PLAN



Guarantees the public can participate and comment on activities funded by the City's HUD grants and meets federal requirements.

- Minimum of 2 public hearings on plans
- 30-day public comment period for plans
- 15-day public notice of hearings
- 15-day public comment period for performance reports
- Ensure accessibility of hearings and documents
- Requires plans and reports are available to the public
