grow in respect and appreciation for all of our cultures and differences by being exposed to one another and working

together; and

WHEREAS, This kind of unity, brightens the future for all of us - and that is

the Spirit of Juneteenth.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I**, Richard Skorman, President of the Colorado Springs City Council, do hereby proclaim the day of June 19, 2020 as
