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Hi Drew,

We have to look at the 2 horizontal to 1 vertical slope of the soil being "reinforced" by the shotcrete. Any thing steeper than a 2:1 slope would have to be viewed as a retaining structure and require permit. Less than 2:1 slope, one would assume the soil would remain in place with no additional reinforcing and the only reason for the shotcrete would be for erosion control or other stormwater reasons.
