FY 2016 at a glance:

- \$1.217 million revenue-sharing payment to the City of Colorado Springs
- \$16.0 million investment in state-of-the-art technology, equipment and new physicians

More Options For Patients

New in 2016:

- First in southern Colorado to perform
 Watchman cardiac procedure August 2016
- First in southern Colorado to use dissolvable stent in heart procedure – October 2016
- Now providing advanced care for all stroke patients, 24/7, reducing the need for these patients in the Pikes Peak region to be airlifted to Denver
- Began performing TAVRs minimally invasive cardiac procedures to repair heart valves, eliminating need for open heart surgeries in many patients
- Mobile Stroke Treatment Unit providing care






- Broke ground on 130,000-square-foot expansion at Memorial Hospital North

Community benefits contribution

\$137.1 million (28% increase from FY15)

Uncompensated/charity care cost




- A national hospital quality database has ranked Memorial in the top 10 percent among more than 250 academic and community hospitals nationwide.


