Hi Molly,

I looked at the proposed changes to this project and I want to go on the record as saying I am opposed to some of these changes. It appears that they want to push the retaining wall further out toward Union, remove the existing sidewalk, and push the sidewalk out closer to Union as well. If so, this will negatively impact the residents who use that sidewalk. We will be walking or running squeezed into a much narrower space between a 10+ ft. wall and a busy six-lane thoroughfare. I am opposed to that part of the proposed changes, and I am putting this out on social media to alert our neighbors and nearby neighborhoods.

I also have another concern. The project is already out of scale with the rest of the surrounding neighborhoods in terms of height, and pushing it out further will exacerbate that. When this project was under initial review in I think 2019, I was of the understanding that it was to be two stories high. Now, the buildings under construction across the street from us are already three stories and it appears they are in the process of adding a fourth. They also raised the ground level higher than the original lot before starting construction, so the effect is going to make this project seem to be more than five stories high in that case.

In addition to going on the record as being opposed to the above project changes, I would also like to formally request a review of whether the current height is aligned with the development plan that was originally approved. I don't recall ever seeing a communication about changes to the number of stories. Even if the fourth story is a façade or tower feature rather than a fourth floor, this feature results in the appearance of a four story building. As I noted previously, what they are currently building is very out of scale to the surrounding neighborhood, and it feels as if it is looming over our neighborhood which may decrease our property values. Thank you in advance for your help with this.

Apparently, the developer wants to push the retaining wall closer to Union, remove the existing sidewalk, and push the sidewalk closer to Union in addition to similar changes on other sides of the project. This will create a much narrower path for people using the sidewalk between a 10+ ft high retaining wall and a busy six-lane

thoroughfare. Colorado Springs promotes itself as a walker/biker friendly city. This change does not reflect that attitude.

The scale of this project is not aligned with the surrounding neighborhood. Originally it was understood that this was to be two stories in height, but now they are building a third story and what may be a fourth story tower or facade on top of that. Maybe the developer is trying to pull a fast one and ask for forgiveness rather than permission once the changes are made. Is the city aware? Is it possible to do an on-site inspection to review whether the project is staying within the original approved plan?
