

Proclamation

MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. DAY

January 17, 2022

WHEREAS, on November 2, 1983, President Ronald Regan signed a bill into law annually recognizing the third Monday of January as Martin Luther King Jr. Day as a Federal holiday in America. Similar legislation was signed by Governor Dick Lamm on April 4, 1985 to recognize the holiday in Colorado; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. was born on January 15, 1929 in Atlanta, Georgia and became an American icon and hero to millions, propelled by his powerful and inspiring message of peaceful protest and nonviolent resistance; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. devoted his life to advancing equality, social justice, and opportunity for all, and challenged all Americans to participate in the never-ending work of building a more perfect union; and

WHEREAS, on August 28, 1963, Dr. King delivered the famous "I Have a Dream" speech on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial in Washington D.C. which became one of the defining moments of the civil rights movement. In the speech, he said "We have also come to this hallowed spot to remind America of the fierce urgency of Now. This is no time to engage in the luxury of cooling off or to take the tranquilizing drug of gradualism. Now is the time to make real the promises of democracy"; and

WHEREAS, on Martin Luther King Jr. Day we honor an American who recognized the great injustice of segregation and discrimination, and made it his life's purpose and toil to right those wrongs in favor of justice, freedom, equality, fairness, and reconciliation.; and

NOW, THEREFORE, The Mayor and Colorado Springs City Council, do hereby proclaim January 17, 2022 as

MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. DAY

in Colorado Springs, Colorado, and urge all citizens to observe this day with appropriate civic, community, and service projects in honor of Dr. King
