OUR HISTORY



- The idea of CICC was conceived in 2014, with the objective of placing construction based vocational education into the public school system - introducing students to Career alternatives.
- In 2015, Careers in Construction (CIC) was created by the Housing & Building Association of Colorado Springs (CSHBA) to facilitate and fund vocational education in area high schools.
- Started at one high school in the Harrison school district, Sierra High School, with 18 students.
- In 2019, CIC partnered with AGC-Colorado to expand the program in the Denver Metro region. Careers in Construction Colorado (CICC) was formed as a non-profit 501(c)(3) entity.

Pre-Apprenticeship Curriculum

Students learn through the nationally recognized Home Builders Institute curriculum — a 75% hands-on, competency-based, industry-validated curriculum approved by the U.S. Department of Labor.

Guest Speakers

Industry professionals bring real-world insight and experience to the classroom, connecting students to current trends, expectations, and opportunities in construction.

Awareness of Opportunities

Students gain awareness by learning the depth and breadth of the construction industry — understanding the many pathways and careers available to help them find the best fit for their goals.

Students gain firsthand experience by visiting active construction sites and seeing projects come to life.

Students spend time alongside industry professionals to understand daily work, roles, and expectations.

Personalized Job Matching

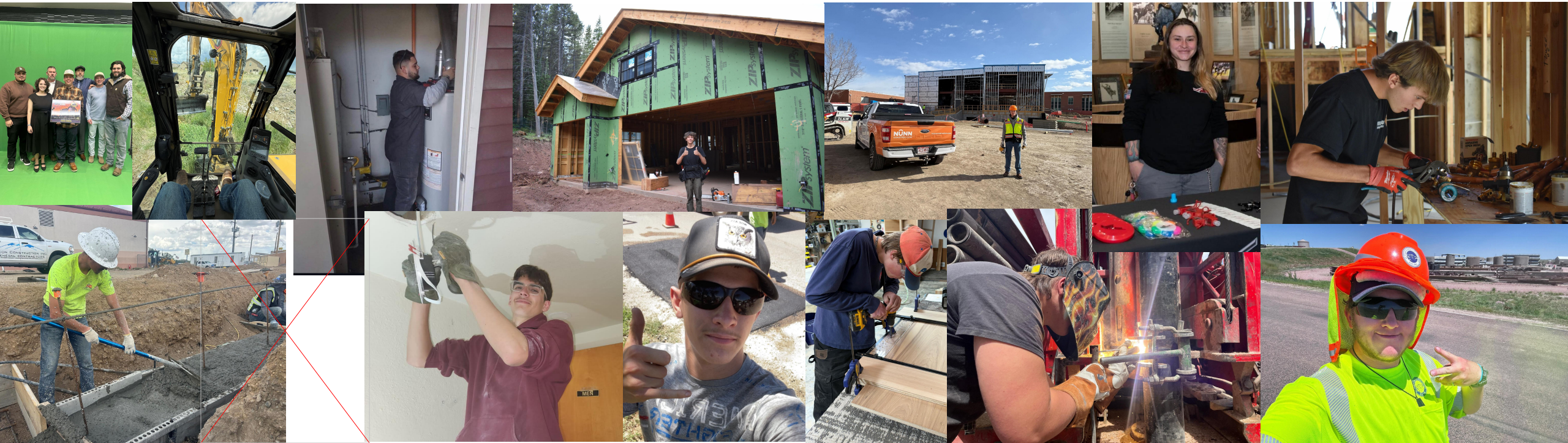
We connect students directly with local employers looking for entry-level talent.

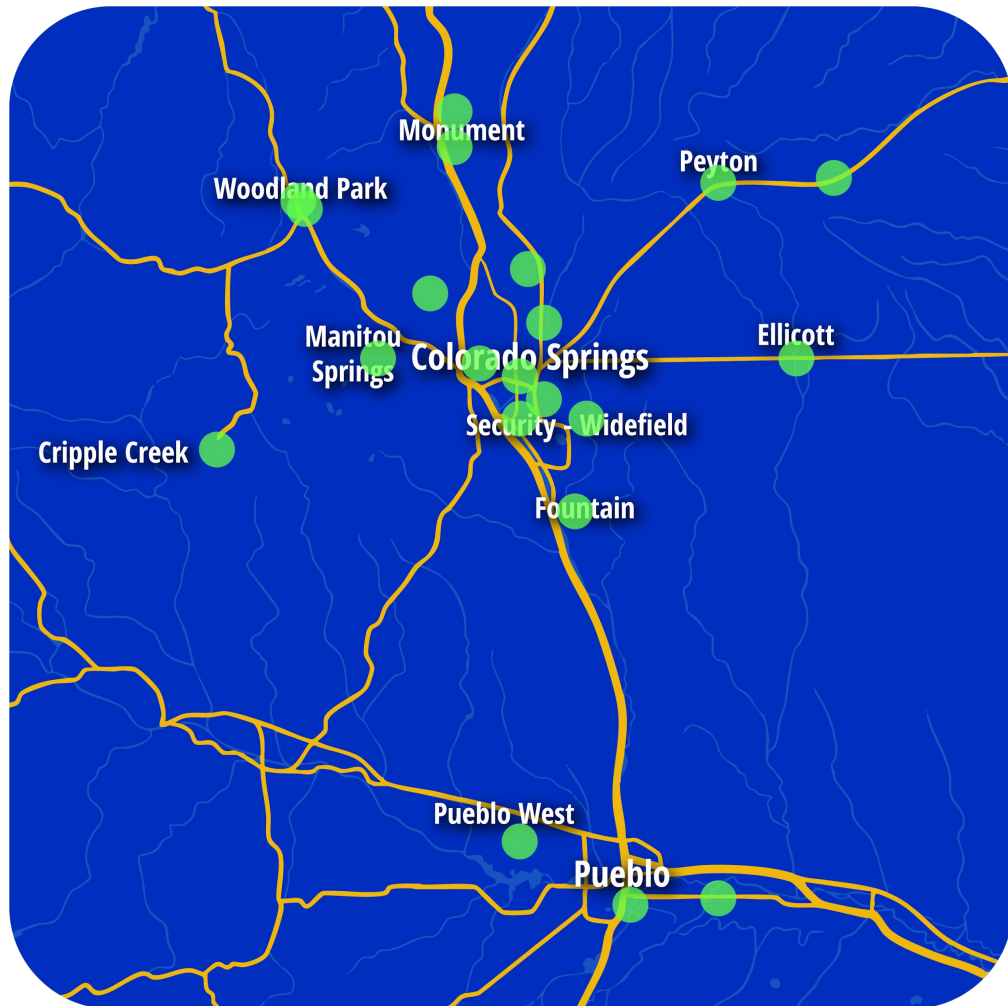
