




Neighborhood Demographics




Age Group Percentages by Neighborhood
























Sample Highlights



Deerfield Community Center

- Food distribution: 5,186 individuals served through either Mobile Pantry or Food Rescue program for a total of 82,203 lbs. of food
- Successful 7-week summer camp for youth at the center
- Provided 6 weeks of Pop Up Play at Wildflower Park
- Supervised Youth Advisory Council for Panorama Park Master Plan

Hillside Community Center

- Food distribution: 1,336 individuals served totaling 14,940 lbs. of food during drive-thru pantry
- Successful 7-week summer camp for youth and teens
- Added Therapeutic Recreation programming on site
- Completed ADA projects including lobby renovation and improved accessibility through the parking lot and front entrance

Meadows Park Community Center

- Food distribution: 3,150 individuals served for a total of 14,600 lbs. of food including contactless drive/walk up
- Successful 7-week summer camp for youth and teens at the center and two neighborhood parks
- HEALGround Playground installation completed
- Air conditioning installed in gymnasium (previously without since beginning in 1982)
- ADA Accessibility Additions: curb cuts in sidewalk by parking lot entrances, ramp access to rear of facility

Westside Community Center

- Over 4,000 senior meals served annually
- Westside Cares food pantry provides weekly distribution
- Completed ADA projects including renovation of four bathrooms and improved accessibility through the parking lot and along the walkways
- New landscaping and parking areas based on approved development plan
