#### **ENTERPRISE ZONE STATE TAX CREDIT**



2-1-1 is a call-in resource line for those who need assistance with housing and shelter, utilities, health care, food, transportation, and more. Our 2-1-1 specialists utilize a database of over 7,200 resources to make referrals to thousands of agencies, programs, and services. In 2015, 2-1-1 took 30,210 calls and is on track to receive more than 40,000 this year. You can help support the 2-1-1 resource and referral hotline through the Enterprise Zone Tax Credit.

#### El Paso County Enterprise Zone Contribution Credit

The Enterprise Zone is comprised of areas identified by the Colorado Economic Development Commission as economically depressed in El Paso County. Projects within the Enterprise Zone create or preserve an environment that will help attract, expand or retain employers in the Enterprise Zone. To encourage Colorado taxpayers to make contributions to non-profits that make improvements to the El Paso County Enterprise Zone, a state income tax credit equal to 25% of monetary contributions is available. The following categories of projects are eligible:

- Marketing of the Enterprise Zone
- Business assistance projects such as incubators
- Infrastructure projects that serve businesses

- Job training program
- Community development projects
- Homeless shelters that promote employment

#### To Take Advantage of the Credit

- Minimum donation of \$250
- Check made payable to El Paso County Enterprise Zone. Memo line: PPUW 211
- Mail to Pikes Peak United Way, 518
   North Nevada Avenue, Colorado
   Springs, CO 80903
- File taxes electronically
- Receive 25% state tax credit
- 12.5% credit for in-kind contributions or stock donations

#### **EXAMPLE:**

Approximately 50% of your gift will be returned to you after taxes

If you donate \$1,000 to the El Paso County Enterprise Zone, it will end up costing you about \$507 if you are in the 28% Federal Income Tax bracket.

- You receive a \$250 Colorado State Enterprise Zone Credit -PPUW 2-1-1
- You receive approximately \$243 Federal and State Income Tax Deduction\*

\*Federal tax deduction is lowered because of the add-back effect of reduced state tax

Please Note: The State of Colorado is requiring anyone wishing to take advantage of the 25% El Paso County Enterprise Zone credit to do the following:

- Provide your FEIN, Social Security Number, or "Colorado Account Number" (go online to apply).
  - File taxes electronically

#### A Gift to Success by 6 or Dolly Parton Imagination Library (DPIL) is intended to:

- Increase the quality and availability of child care in our community
- Help bring \$1 for \$1 Federal matching funds into our state
- Give the donor a 50% Colorado state income tax credit

#### Approximately 67% of your gift will be returned to you after taxes.

If you donate \$1,000 to one of the qualified programs, it will end up costing you about \$327 if you are in the 28% Federal Income Tax bracket.

- You receive a \$500 Colorado State Child Care Contribution Credit.
- You receive approximately \$173 Federal and State Income Tax Deduction\*

#### Your gift will be doubled.


• Your \$1,000 will be matched dollar-for-dollar with Federal Matching Funds through the Child Care and Development Fund and returned to the state of Colorado.

## **Pikes Peak United Way Programs**

211 is the free, bilingual, easy-to-remember three-digit phone number that serves residents of 12 counties (Alamosa, Coneios, Costilla, Chaffee, Chevenne, El Paso, Lincoln, Mineral, Park, Rio Grande, Saguache, and Teller), helping those in need navigate the complex and ever-growing maze of health and human service providers in their community. Trained information specialists staff the hotline from 8 am to 5 pm Monday through Friday using a comprehensive database of thousands of resources including federal, state, and local government agencies, private non-profits, as well as faith and community-based organizations. By directing people to the right resources and preparing them for their visit, 211 promotes higher assistance success and decreases frustrations. Last year, Pikes Peak United Way 211 provided life-changing information and referrals to countless individuals and families in crisis.




- Assisted over 30,000 clients with referrals to access resources in their local community.

  During the 1st quarter of 2017, 30% of calls related to housing or rental assistance, 19% related to income or tax assistance, and 14% related to utility assistance.

## DOLLY PARTON'S IMAGINATION LIBRARY (DPIL) Dolly Parton's Imagination Library is a unique early

years book gifting program that mails a new, age appropriate book to enrolled children every month from birth to five years old, creating a home library of up to 60 books and instilling a love for reading from an early age.





- Over 5,000 children are participating in DPIL through Pikes Peak United Way.
- Children participating in DPIL have increased their vocabulary, social skills and listening skills due to receiving books from DPIL.
- Other family members are benefiting from just one child being enrolled in the program, to include parents increasing their own reading habits.

FREEDOM SPRINGS Pikes Peak United Way and Colorado Springs has committed to ending Veteran homelessness through efforts involving the Mayor's Office, the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs, the U.S Department of Housing and Urban Development, and local non-profit social services providers. Regardless Colorado Springs suffers from a lack of affordable housing and currently has no project-based permanent supportive housing developments addressing the needs of Veterans who are seeking to end their homelessness.



Pikes Peak United Way's new Freedom Springs will change that.



- By offering affordable housing and on-site supportive services to develop and maintain stability, Freedom Springs will provide a uniquely supportive community environment for formerly homeless Veterans.
- A Low Income Housing Tax Credit (LIHTC) development, Freedom Springs will include 50 one-bedroom apartments.

Volunteer Income Tax Assistance is an IRS-Sponsored program which provides free tax preparation for low to moderate income individuals and families to help them access the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) - a refundable federal tax credit
