



Child Abuse Overview

Every year in the United States, 3.6 million referrals of child abuse are made.

- Physical
- Psychological
- Behavioral difficulties
- Society costs are great



Why the need for CASA is so great in the Pikes Peak Region



- The Pikes Peak Region gets the MOST calls to the child abuse and neglect hotline every year.
- According to Colorado DHS, there were over 14,500 calls in El Paso County alone last year.
- Hundreds of these children are placed in foster care or another form of out-of-home placement each year.



Dependency & Neglect

- CASA is appointed to open Dependency & Neglect cases by the court when there is an element of abuse, neglect, domestic violence, or a child in out of home placement.
- Volunteers complete 30 hours of training before being sworn in as officers of the court.
- Once appointed to a case, the volunteer acts as the "eyes and ears" of the court, making recommendations to the judge on what is in the best interest of the child.





Dependency & Neglect

The Impact of the Volunteer Advocate:


- Studies have shown that children with CASA volunteers find permanent homes more quickly than children without CASA volunteers.
- Children with CASA volunteers do better in school and are more likely to graduate from high school.
- Children with CASA volunteers are less likely to age out of foster care at 18 without a permanent home.

Last year, we served 607 children with volunteer advocates and 99% of the children did NOT experience re-abuse or re-neglect.

Supervised Exchange & Parenting Time

- SEPT volunteer facilitators make it possible for parents and children to visit when there is a court order in place for supervised visits.
- Volunteer facilitators document visits or exchanges for the court and ensure safety by intervening when necessary.
- CASA has SEPT visitation rooms in both El Paso and Teller counties.

Last year, we served 100 families and 155 children in our SEPT program through 1,445 visits and 66 exchanges.





Milton Foster Children's Fund

- Funding for normalizing experiences that build confidence and resiliency
- Teen life skills classes to prepare foster teens for the transition to adulthood
- The Hanger, a store where foster teens can shop for free and also gain work experience

Last year, in this program, 68 children received grant funding, 223 teens took part in our teen programs, and 190 teens shopped at The Hanger.








2019-2020 Financials
