ORDINANCE NO. 25 - 88

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 7 (UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE) OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF COLORADO SPRINGS 2001, AS AMENDED, PERTAINING TO ANIMAL KENNELS.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLORADO SPRINGS:

Section 1. Part 2 (Allowed Use Tables) of Article 3 (Use Regulations) of Chapter 7 (Unified Development Code) of the Code of the City of Colorado Springs 2001, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

Section 2. Section 303 (Commercial and Industrial Uses) of Part 3 (Use-Specific Standards) of Article 3 (Use Regulations) of Chapter 7 (Unified Development Code) of the Code of the City of Colorado Springs 2001, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

7.3.303: COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL USES:

- A. Agriculture and Animal-Related Services:
 - 1. Animal Shelters, Kennels, Pet Services, and Veterinary ServicesAnimal Care Facility and Small Animal Clinic:
 - a. Animal Shelters. Any animal shelter and any associated animal run, enclosure, or other outdoor animal use must have a setback of at least twenty-five feet (25'), except that when an adjacent property is residentially used or zoned as R-E, R-1 9, R-1 6, R-2, R-4, R-5, R-Flex Low, R-Flex Medium, or R-Flex High, the use must have a setback of at least fifty five feet (55'). Each building and any associated animal run shall be constructed at least fifty-five (55) feet from any property line.
 - b. Kennels. Any kennel building and any associated animal run, enclosure, or other outdoor animal use must have a setback of at least twenty-five feet (25'), except that when an adjacent property is residentially used or zoned as R-E, R-1 9, R-1 6, R-2, R-4, R-5, R-Flex Low, R-Flex Medium, or R-Flex High, the use must have a setback of at least fifty five feet (55'). Except in the A zone district, all activities shall be conducted within a totally and permanently enclosed, soundproofed building.
 - c. Pet Services. All operations must be located within a completely enclosed buildingln the A zone district, outdoor veterinary activities require.\

conditional use permit approval pursuant to Section 7.5.601 (Conditional Use Permit).

d. Veterinary Services. All veterinary activities must be conducted within a completely enclosed building. Outdoor veterinary activities may be allowed within the A zone district with a conditional use permitting the same.

Section 3. Section 1003 (Parking Space Requirements by Use) of Part 10 (Parking and Loading) of Article 4 (Development Standards and Incentives) of Chapter 7(Unified Development Code) of the Code of the City of Colorado Springs 2001, as amended to read as follows:

Section 4. Section 301 (Definitions) of Part 3 (Definitions) of Article 6 (Definitions and Rules of Construction) of Chapter 7 (Unified Development Code) of the Code of the City of Colorado Springs 2001, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

ANIMAL CARE FACILITY: A facility maintained by or for the use of a licensed veterinarian in the diagnosis, treatment, and prevention of animal diseases, including veterinary services, or in which bearding, breeding, greeming, training, and daytime or overnight care of more than four (4) domesticated animals is permitted. This use also includes public facilities for the temporary impoundment of animals found abandoned or removed from other locations due to improper care and may include an animal crematorium as an accessory use.

ANIMAL SHELTERS: Buildings or structures where animals may be boarded, impounded, cared for, or sold, which may include onsite outdoor exercise spaces or facilities for disposing of lost, stray, unwanted, dead, or injured animals.

* * *

KENNELS: Buildings or structures where at least a total of five (5) dogs, cats, or other small animals are kept and maintained with or without charge on behalf of other persons. The primary uses associated with this category are animal daycare facilities and boarding. Other uses include ancillary veterinary services, retail sales, grooming, training, breeding, and care services for dogs, cats, and other small animals on the premises.

INDOOR ONLY: Services are completely contained within a building.

INDOOR AND OUTDOOR: Provided services include both indoor facilities and outdoor facilities, such as runs or enclosures, including areas completely enclosed by fences.

PET SERVICES: This category includes pet specific services and sales that do not include veterinary services. The primary uses associated with this category are sales and grooming of animals, incidental pet health services, and training of small animals used as household pets. This use excludes animal shelters, veterinary services, and kennels.

SMALL ANIMAL CLINIC: A facility maintained by or for the use of a licensed veterinarian in the diagnosis, treatment, and prevention of animal diseases in which the animals are limited to dogs, cats, and other comparable household pets and in which the evernight care of such animals is permitted when necessary for medical treatment. The facility may include a crematerium for small animals as an accessory use.

* * *

VETERINARY SERVICES: An establishment for the medical treatment and care of animals by a licensed professional where overnight boarding of animals is allowed if directly related to a veterinary procedure. The two (2) types of veterinary services are:

SMALL ANIMAL: For dogs, cats, and other small animals, where the veterinary services must be in completely enclosed buildings; and

LARGE ANIMAL: For livestock and other large animals, where veterinary services may be conducted outside in the A zone district with an approved conditional use.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its final adoption and publication as provided by Charter.

Section 6. Council deems it appropriate that this Ordinance be published by title and summary prepared by the City Clerk and that this ordinance be available for inspection and acquisition in the office of the City Clerk.
