A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF COLORADO SPRINGS AND EL PASO COUNTY, COLORADO, FOR THE ADMINISTRATION, OPERATION AND MAINTAINANCE OF TRAFFIC SIGNALS OWNED BY EL PASO COUNTY

WHEREAS, the City of Colorado Springs (“City”) and El Paso County (“County”) desire to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement to address the administration, operation and maintenance of County owned traffic signals; and

WHEREAS this agreement will benefit the citizens of both the City and the County in the consistency and timeliness in addressing service calls, emergency after hour calls, and traffic signal timing changes regardless of ownership of the roadways; and

WHEREAS, in support of a regional approach to traffic management, the City and County have identified an opportunity to centralize intersection signal operations and maintenance; and

WHEREAS, the City has the expertise to assume responsibility for the County’s signalized intersections, for which the County agrees to reimburse the City; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement will benefit all citizens of the County by providing a cost-efficient and effective structure for the management of the County’s signalized intersections.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLORADO SPRINGS:**

Section 1. The City Council approves the Intergovernmental Agreement between the City of Colorado Springs, Colorado, and El Paso County, Colorado, for the administration, operation, and maintenance of County-owned traffic signals, in substantially the same form as Exhibit A, attached hereto.

Section 2. The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute, administer, amend and renew the intergovernmental agreement.
