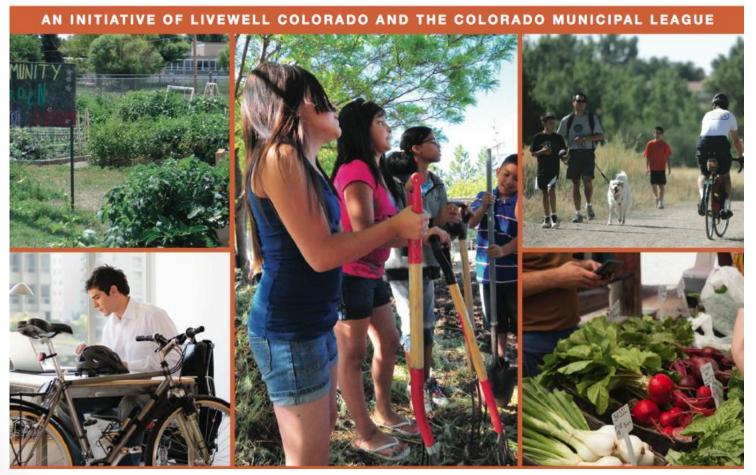

## What is the Healthy Eating and Active Living (HEAL) Campaign?





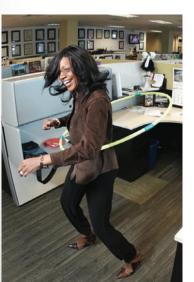


 HEAL is: a collaboration between LiveWell Colorado, the Colorado Municipal League and cities and towns across Colorado

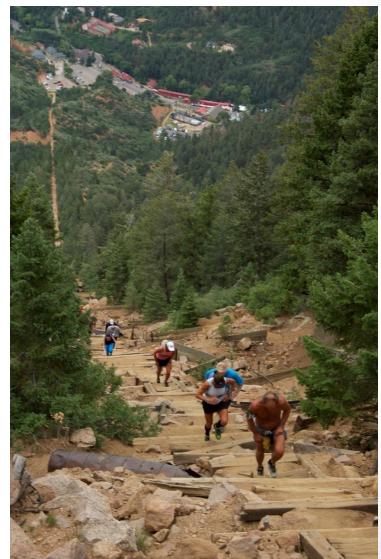
## What is the Healthy Eating and Active Living Campaign?











#### HEAL Campaign Areas of Focus

#### ACTIVE COMMUNITY

Policies concerning land use, planning, zoning, infrastructure development, etc.

#### **HEALTHY FOOD ACCESS**

Policies regarding farmers' markets, urban agriculture, ways to attract healthy food vendors and more

#### **HEALTHY WORKPLACE**

Policies that increase opportunities for physical activity and healthy eating for municipal employees

#### **HEAL Community Rankings**

Eager Cities & Towns join the Campaign by adopting a HEAL Cities & **EAGER** Towns Campaign Resolution, expressing the intent to work with us on at least one HEAL policy area. Active Cities & Towns are municipalities that already have at least one HEAL policy on their books before joining the Campaign. They join our Campaign by submitting this policy as well as adopting a resolution **ACTIVE** expressing the intent to work with us on additional HEAL policies. Eager Cities & Towns become Active by adopting a second HEAL policy. Fit Cities & Towns are those that have adopted a policy in each of our three outlined policy areas after joining the Campaign. Elite Cities & Towns have adopted the three policies described in our ELITE Fit category plus two additional policies, bringing the total to five policies.

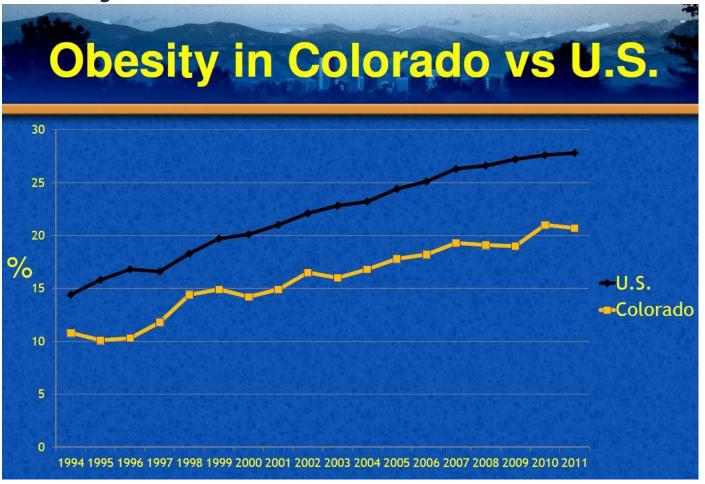




#### LiveWell Colorado

#### City Employee Wellness Program Reach Your Peak



#### Reach Your Peak Impacts Include:



Improved health outcomes for participants, moving from high number of risk factors to moderate and those with moderate number of risk factors moving to low.



Average of 19% less in medical & prescription claims costs for those who participate vs. not participate in wellness.



18 participants quit tobacco use in the last two years.



78% of survey responders (2014) who participate in RYP have made strides in changes to improve their health.
