


2020 GF Summary





2020 GF Fund Balance





2.0% Sales and Use Tax:

- S&U combined up 29.66% for the month and up 31.02% year-to-date
 - Sales tax up 30.37% for the month and up 31.62% year-to-date
 - Use tax up 13.58% for the month and up 19.29% year-to-date

2.0% Lodger's Tax & 1.0% Auto Rental Tax:

- LART Combined up 307.67% for the month and up 80.64% year-to-date
 - Lodger's Tax up 313.88% for the month and up 84.62% year-to-date
 - Auto Rental Tax up 244.81% for the month and up 48.22% year-to-date












Index of Consumer Sentiment







Pikes Peak Region Residential Building Permits







Pikes Peak Region Home Sales Single Family/Patio Homes








