 - 7 of 1000 people ride bicycles to work

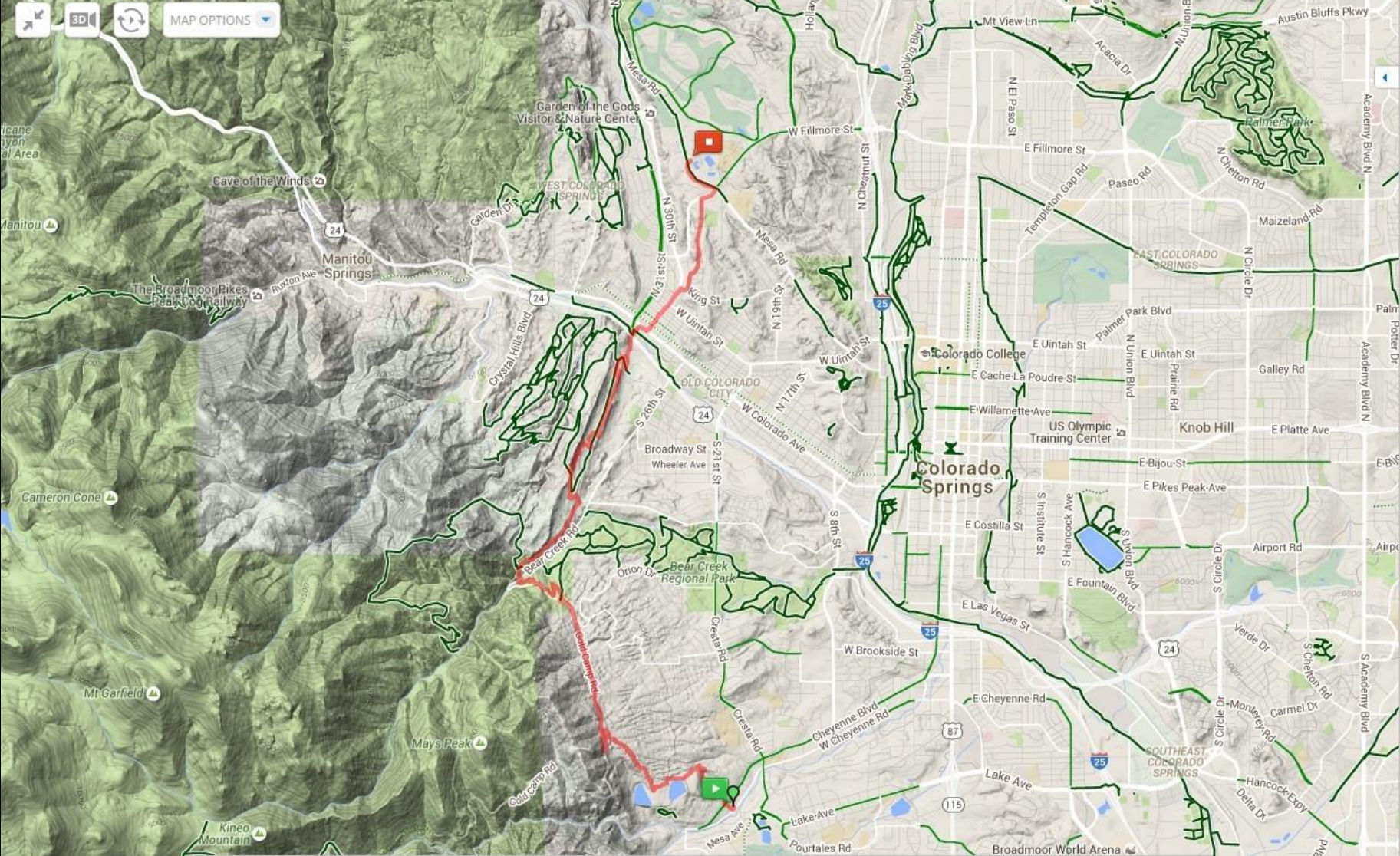
Our CO Competition

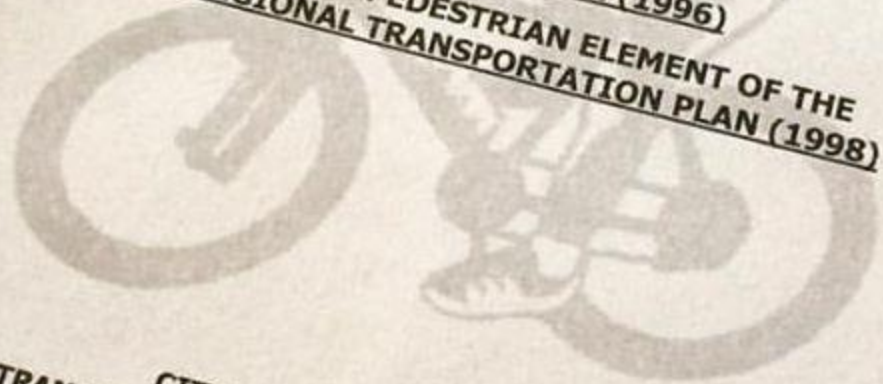
