Proposed Changes to the Utilities Rules and Regulations (URR)

- Water and Wastewater Extension Policy for Oversize Reimbursement
 - Water URR Section VIII.B.1., Sheet No. 91
 - Wastewater URR Section IX.C.1., Sheet No. 112

Background


- Utilities master plans water and wastewater systems required to be built by the developer
- In some instances, Utilities requires oversized mains to accommodate future demand outside the planned build area
- Current effective URR's require the developer to pay 100% of the construction cost for water service and Utilities reimburses the difference in material cost for oversizing

Utilities has no oversize policy for wastewater

Oversize Visual Representation

Current Policy

- Developer pays entire cost.
- Springs Utilities reimburses developer for difference in material costs due to Oversizing.
- Developer applies for recovery of cost for Base Diameter from upstream developments.



Proposed Policy

- Developer pays entire cost.
- Developer applies for recovery of cost for Base Capacity from adjacent developments.
- Developer applies for recovery of Oversize Capacity costs from areas benefitting from Oversizing.

Proposed URR Change


- Modifying URRs to change the way oversize reimbursements for water and wastewater mains are allocated, funded and recovered
 - Utilities may require a developer to construct a water or wastewater main that is larger than that needed to serve the developer
 - Utilities will calculate allocation of costs based on Oversize Capacity made available by the larger main and the area to be served
 - The constructing developer may recover Oversize Capacity costs from future developers who will benefit from the Oversize Capacity
- If approved, effective August 1, 2020
