Comments Incorporated

- <u>Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault</u> "sexual assault" was included with references to domestic violence and descriptions of homeless services and shelter were expanded to include victims of domestic violence and sexual assault
- <u>Economic Development</u> included as a tool to meet the goal to stabilize and improve struggling neighborhoods
- <u>Citizen Participation</u> uses of social media and other forms of outreach, a definition of low and moderate income and a general timeline for activities were added
- Plan includes a description of the citizen participation process and organizations that participated.

Other Themes

- Accessibility
 - Address needs in housing, transportation, infrastructure and employment
- Neighborhoods
 - Ensure Southeast receives a fair share of funding
 - Improve facilities providing public services to neighborhoods;
 support neighborhood leadership; eliminate food deserts
 - Continue to support Code Enforcement city-wide
 - Encourage greater participation by minorities and non-English speaking persons as well as persons with disabilities; ensure broad outreach

Other Themes

Economic Development

- Create more jobs available to low income residents
- Identify appropriate uses for federal block grants to improve economic vitality, and align activities with economic development plans, especially in geographic target areas

Homelessness

 Continue to work to end homelessness and include the homeless in identifying priorities

Affordable Housing

- More accessible, affordable housing located near public transit
- Don't concentrate affordable housing in low income areas
- Engage private sector
