





Respiratory Season

- Pediatric hospitals, units and emergency departments experience and annual surge of pediatric patient with respiratory and flu symptoms on an annual basis during the respiratory/flu season
- Penrose St. Francis announced closure of their 12-bed pediatric unit at end of October
- CHCO-COS is partnering with UCHealth Memorial to ensure access to beds for pediatric patients during surge periods
- Physician staffing and clinical team staffing work is initiated to cover additional beds





COVID-19 Readiness

- We are closely monitoring this evolving situation and are prepared and ready to treat patients with suspected or confirmed 2019 novel Coronavirus (COVID-19).
- Our clinical staff has been specially trained on how to identify, isolate and treat patients with COVID-19 and other contagious illnesses.
- We are working closely with the County and State to report confirmed cases.

Injury Prevention

- Lead agency for Safe Kids Colorado Springs, a community coalition that is part of the international Safe Kids Worldwide
- Established monthly car seat inspection station at a CSFD station to offer free car seat checks due to record-setting traffic fatalities
- Also offer outreach activities, education and resources on bicycle and pedestrian safety, home safety and safe sleep, fire and burn safety and additional safety risks like playground safety, water safety, school bus safety and more

Community Partnerships in Action

Universally screening for suicide risk in all urgent care, inpatient and ED locations, including Briargate.

Analyzing this data set to look at youth who screen at high or modest risk and use the data to inform more targeted prevention efforts with YMCA and other community partners.



Working with Colorado Springs Health Foundation to address social determinants contributing to health outcomes in youth in southeast Colorado Springs.

Engaging with community partners like the YMCA to determine what model and what settings will be most effective to integrate health education and community resource connection/navigation support.
