







PlanCOS recommended 6 key initiatives be undertaken in order to implement the plan's vision and goals:

- 4. Smart Cities Initiative (SmartCOS)
- 5. Annexation Plan (AnnexCOS)
- 6. Neighborhood Planning Program



12 total plans Priority based on need








- Land use and built environment focused plans that also consider:
 - Transportation, housing, economic development, public safety, etc.
- Healthy Community Planning:
 - Establishing a set of healthy community indicators which will focus on resident health, food access, and climate resiliency
 - A health assessment of the plan area may be conducted to better understand a plan area's context
- Highly replicable, but with room to customize based on area's unique characteristics
- Hired MIG to assist following a competitive RFP ranking and interview process



- Collaborating closely with CONO and will utilize CONO's new Neighborhood Network Boards, in conjunction with the City Council representative(s), as the 'steering committee'
 - Neighborhood Network Boards will ensure a resident-lead process and provide valuable expertise and lived experience





Update on Southeast Strong Community Plan





- Kicked off mid-2020
- Formed Steering Committee chaired by Councilor Avila
- Held 10 meetings discussing key topics
 - Economic development, health equity, transportation planning and traffic safety, parks and trails, and land use
- Southeast Colorado Springs has "plan and surveyfatigue"
 - Heavily influenced the plan to be action/implementationoriented, and to be very purposeful with public engagement
 - "Survey of surveys"




- Data shows a 16-year life expectancy disparity between residents of southeast Colorado Springs and residents of other neighborhoods and an urban heat island effect
- Staff hired a consultant to produce a health assessment of the Southeast Strong plan area
- Data compared the plan area to the rest of the city, using the city's average as the baseline.
- Some data sets affirmed what we already knew, but others left us with questions




- Group interpretation with the Steering Committee to determine the findings of the health assessment.

Sidewalk Connectivity






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- What else?
 - Kicking off "Design Out Crime" assessment with the Quad Innovation Alliance
 - Return on Investment analysis to show the fiscal impacts of the Southeast Strong Community Plan's implementation
 - Producing a 2021 Academy Boulevard Progress Report which will support future studies
 - Working on/supporting grant requests for projects in southeast
 - Discovered clear hotspot for crimes against property and upgrade the street light bulbs for better light coverage in hope of discouraging future instances
