The Pikes Peak Area Council of Governments (PPACG) is a voluntary association of municipal and county governments.



PPACG serves as the state designated metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for the Colorado Springs metro area, which includes all the area military bases.














### **Chapter 1: Introduction**

#### Relevance (Why is this plan necessary?)

The creation of a long-range transportation plan is required to comply with federal and state laws and regulations for regional and statewide transportation planning. Transportation planning within metropolitan areas is defined by three major pieces of federal legislation: Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21, the current enactment of federal transportation legislation), the Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990, and the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

As the federally designated metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for the Colorado Springs metropolitan area, the Pikes Peak Area Council of Governments (PPACG) is responsible for developing and maintaining both a long-range regional transportation plan (an RTP) and a supporting short-range implementation program, the transportation improvement program (TIP), as a condition of eligibility for federal transportation funding. The PPACG transportation planning area, the MPO area, is shown in Figure 1-1.



# Transportation: Long Range Planning





PPACG adopted the *Moving Forward:* 2035 Regional Transportation Plan in January 2012. New 2040 Plan to be developed by October 2014. The plan includes regionally significant projects in the region valued in the billions of dollars.

# RESOLUTION BY THE PIKES PEAK AREA COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS BOARD OF DIRECTORS APPROVING THE 2013-2018 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM FOR THE COLORADO SPRINGS METROPOLITAN AREA

#### September 12, 2012

WHEREAS, Title 23, Section 134 and Title 49, United States Code, as updated by the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU), require each urban area to have a comprehensive transportation planning process that results in transportation plans and programs consistent with the planned development of an urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the aforementioned legislation, the Pikes Peak Area Council of Governments was designated by the Governor of the State of Colorado as the Metropolitan Planning Organization responsible for carrying out the transportation planning process; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the PPACG acts to meet the transportation planning and programming requirements of Title 23 and Title 49, United States Code, and for formulating policies, plans and programs necessary to the planning process for transportation, land use, and air quality management; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Clean Air Act, as amended, 1977, the Pikes Peak Area Council of Governments was designated by the Governor of the State of Colorado as the lead Air Quality Planning Agency for the Colorado Springs Urbanizing Area; and

WHEREAS, the Colorado Springs Urbanizing Area has been designated a maintenance area for carbon monoxide by the United States Environmental Protection Agency; and

WHEREAS, the Pikes Peak Area Council of Governments' Board of Directors is responsible for determining conformity of all transportation plans, programs and projects with the Clean Air Act, as amended, 1990, and the Carbon Monoxide Maintenance Plan for the Colorado Springs Attainment/Maintenance Area, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Advisory Committee of the Pikes Peak Area Council of Governments and the Colorado Air Pollution Control Division and Department of Transportation have reviewed the conformity documentation detailed in Appendix C of the 2013–2018 Transportation Improvement Program and have determined that it is consistent with the Clean Air Act, as amended, 1990, and the Carbon Monoxide Maintenance Plan for the Colorado Springs Attainment/Maintenance Area, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Colorado Department of Transportation and Pikes Peak Area Council of Governments have jointly determined the 2013–2018 Transportation Improvement Program is fiscally constrained;

NOW, BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, the Pikes Peak Area Council of Governments' Board of Directors has determined that the 2013–2018

Transportation Improvement Program is in conformity with the Clean Air Act, as amended, 1990, and the Carbon Monoxide Maintenance Plan for the Colorado Springs Attainment/Maintenance Area in accordance with the conformity rule, and adequately addresses metropolitan planning requirements for the preparation of a transportation improvement program as defined in SAFETEA-LU; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, The Pikes Peak Area Council of Governments' Board of Directors, acting for and on behalf of its affected local governmental units, hereby approves the 2013–2018 Transportation Improvement Program.

#### **RESOLUTION BY** THE PIKES PEAK AREA COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS ROARD OF DIRECTORS PRIORITIZING TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS IN THE PIKES PEAK REGION

#### March 14, 2012

WHEREAS, in 1999 the Colorado 28 Strategic Corridors/7th Pot projects were determined by the voters of the State of Colorado and the citizens of the Pikes Peak region to be the state's top priorities; and

WHEREAS, the Pikes Peak Area Council of Governments was designated by the Governor of the State of Colorado as the Metropolitan Planning Organization responsible for carrying out the transportation planning process including formulating policies, plans, and programs necessary to the planning process for transportation, land use, and air quality management; and

WHEREAS, the Pikes Peak Area Council of Governments Board of Directors recognizes that there is a significant need for infrastructure improvements in the Pikes Peak region; and

NOW, BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, the Pikes Peak Area Council of Governments Board of Directors, acting for and on behalf of its affected local governments, is hereby committed to working with the Colorado Department of Transportation and all other appropriate local, state, and federal agencies to implement the following priority list of transportation projects in the Pikes Peak region:

- 1) I-25/US 24-Cimarron Street Interchange; Phase 1 Southbound off-ramp
- 2) I-25/US 24-Cimarron Street Interchange; Phase 2 Southbound on-ramp
- 3) US 24/8th Street; widen to I-25 and construct single point urban interchange
- Powers Boulevard widen to six lanes from current termini to Fountain Boulevard
- Powers Boulevard / Stewart Avenue Interchange with Peterson AFB
- Powers Boulevard extension from SH 83 to I-25
- 1-25 widening to six lanes from Interquest Parkway to Monument
- I-25/Fillmore Street; create diverging diamond interchange (DDI)

RESOLVED, APPROVED, AND ADOPTED by the Board of Directors of the Pikes Peak Area Council of Governments this 14th day of March, 2012, at Colorado Springs, Colorado.

- 1) Add \$195,519 in Safe Routes to School funds for the Van Buren Street Walk and Bike to School Access Project
- 2) Add \$724,000 in federal Bridge Off State Highway System funds for the rehabilitation of four structures on Circle Drive.

Ms. Kathleen Krager, City of Colorado Springs Traffic Engineer, was available to answer questions on local match and the project selection process for the city. Project selections are made by City staff on a need/funding basis. City of Manitou Springs Mayor Snyder moved to approve the two requests as Amendment #7 to the FY 2013-FY 2018 TIP. The motion to approve carried unanimously.

#### C. FY 2014 & FY 2015 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)

Ms. Yolanda Roberts, Transportation Planner, requested that the Board review the federally-required product for the metropolitan planning organization. The UPWP is written for a two-year period and incorporates all federal, state, regional, local, and air quality transportation planning activities. It gives an annual schedule of work that identifies how funds will be spent. The UPWP was prepared and reviewed by CDOT, FHWA, FTA, MMT, and the TAC through May, June, and July of 2013.

Town of Green Mountain Falls Trustee Tyler Stevens moved approval of the FY 2014-FY 2015 UPWP. The motion to approve carried unanimously.

#### D. MPACT 64 Ballot Initiative Proposal

Mr. Craig Casper, Transportation Director, presented PPACG advisory committee and staff recommended priority lists for regional transportation projects as requested by CDOT for a potential statewide ballot initiative.

A final motion to approve forwarding the above project list to CDOT for use in developing the possible ballot measure for November 2014 carried unanimously.

The motion included two notes: 1) that other funding mechanisms would proceed and 2) that language on the ballot be included to allow MPOs greater flexibility in using designated transit dollars.

In addition, the motion included the caveat that adjustments to this list would be made over the next year depending on the outcome of the long range planning process that was currently underway.

CDOT Region 2 requests an amendment to the PPACG 2013-2018 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The amendment encompasses funds the following action:

I-25 at Cimarron Interchange. - **\$40,733,874** of Strategic Corridor funding will need to be added into the PPACG TIP to various fiscal years per the RAMP application for the Cimarron Interchange from the Powers corridor to the Cimarron project as agreed in the development process of the interchange project between CDOT Region 2 and the PPACG Board of Directors . These funds will be utilized to build the new interchange as outlined in the RAMP application. The allocations are as follows:

Currently in the Project and budgeted: \$12,266,126

Currently awarded through the RAMP application process: \$ 30,000,000, --- \$24,000,000 RAMP and \$6,000,000 Local Match.

Local funds committed: STP metro allocation of \$2,000,000;

Recent TIP amendment for \$10,000,000 FASTER Safety funds in Fiscal year 2015.



PPACG administers the Pikes Peak Rural Transportation Authority (PPRTA), an innovative mechanism for local transportation funding.

In 2004, voters of El Paso County, Colorado Springs, Manitou Springs, and Green Mountain Falls voted to create the PPRTA, granting it the authority to levy a one-cent sales and use tax for specific transportation projects. Extended in 2012 with 80% vote.
