ISSUES FOR DECISION 2023 RATE CASE HEARING OCTOBER 25, 2022

Water Service:

- 1. Is an increase to the Water Service revenues of approximately \$10.4 million appropriate for the 2023 rate case test-year period?
- 2. Should rates and tariffs for the following Water Service Rate Schedules be revised as proposed:
 - a. Residential Service
 - b. Nonresidential Service
 - c. Large Nonseasonal Service
 - d. Contract Service Military
 - e. Contract Service Regional
 - f. Nonpotable
 - g. Augmentation
 - h. Temporary Service Hydrant Use
- 3. Should Utilities modify Large Nonseasonal Service to standardize optional rate contract expiration and renewal dates?
- 4. Should Utilities add Contract Service Regional, Standby Service as proposed?

Wastewater Service:

- 1. Is an increase to the Wastewater Service revenues of approximately \$2.8 million appropriate for the 2023 rate case test-year period?
- 2. Should rates and tariffs for the following Wastewater Service Rate Schedules be revised as proposed:
 - a. Residential Service
 - b. Nonresidential Service
 - c. Contract Service Military
 - d. Contract Service Regional

3. Should Utilities make administrative changes to the Residential and Nonresidential Service rate schedules as proposed?

Electric Service:

- 1. Should Utilities modify the Residential Service Time-of-Day (ETR) option as proposed and with an effective date of June 1, 2023?
- 2. Should Utilities modify the Commercial Service General Time-of-Day Option (ETC) Access and Facility Charges, per kWh?
- 3. Should Utilities remove obsolete references to the Industrial Service Large Power and Light (ELG) Supply Credit?
- 4. Should Utilities modify general provisions to standardize optional rate contract expiration and renewal dates?
- 5. Should Utilities modify the Community Solar Garden Bill Credit (Pilot Program) to broaden program availability to include non-profit organizations?
- 6. Should Utilities adjust the Green Power Service rate, add the ability to change the rate as frequently as monthly, and increase the program limit to 12,000,000 kWh per month?
- 7. Should Utilities add the Electric Vehicle Public Charging Service Time-of-Day to Utilities' electric rate schedules?
- 8. Should Utilities add the Interruptible Service to Utilities' electric rate schedules effective October 1, 2023?

Natural Gas Service:

- 1. Should Utilities make an administrative correction of general provisions to the Monthly Index definition?
- 2. Should Utilities modify general provisions to standardize optional rate contract expiration and renewal dates?

- 3. Should Utilities modify the Industrial Service Interruptible (G2I, G3M) to add a provision allowing waiver of overrun charges in certain instances, lengthen the customer contract termination notice timeframe, and remove exemptions from the backup fuel requirement?
- 4. Should Utilities modify the Contract Service Military Interruptible (GCS-INTS, GCS-G7M) to add a provision allowing waiver of overrun charges in certain instances?

Utilities Rules and Regulations:

- 1. Should Utilities modify the general provisions to allow acceptance of a customer executed information release form in a form provided by a state or federal assistance entity?
- 2. Should Utilities change the water and wastewater extension policies as proposed?
- 3. Should Utilities add a Standby Service Option Water Regional System Availability fee as proposed?

Open Access Transmission Tariff:

1. Should Utilities modify the Open Access Transmission Tariff Standard Large generator Interconnection Procedures and Standard large Generator Interconnection Agreement as proposed?
