Situation

- Residential marijuana grows highlighted
 - High risk to electrical systems
 - High risk of mold
 - High risk to first responders
 - Confirmed fires due to various risks

Tasks

- Assigned to Division of the Fire Marshal (DFM)
 - Identify risks of flora operations in residences
 - o Identify solutions to mitigate unreasonable risks
 - Collaborate with
 - Pikes Peak Regional Building Department
 - Colorado Springs Utilities
 - Colorado Springs Police Department
 - El Paso County Public Health Department



DFM Tasks Continued

- Draft an amendment of the International Fire Code
 - Appendix P Indoor Flora Grow Operations in Residential Occupancies
 - What this does: Regulates intensive grow operations that should not be in residences
 - What this does NOT do: Prohibit people from growing plants in a home where grow lights, extensive chemicals, and/or supplements are NOT utilized



Restrictions

- Amendment prohibits
 - Excessive plant growth in motels/apartments
 - Construction modifications
 - Extensive chemicals
 - Excessive electrical overload
- Amendment limits the aggregate area containing supplemental lighting for plant growth and consumption to 150 square feet



Public Process

- Internal/External agency vetting of amendment
 - City Attorney's Office
 - Colorado Springs Fire Board of Appeals
 - Flora Task Group
 - Very few modifications to draft were made
 - Collaborative effort by Flora Task Group
 - Our Unanimous support of amendment!
