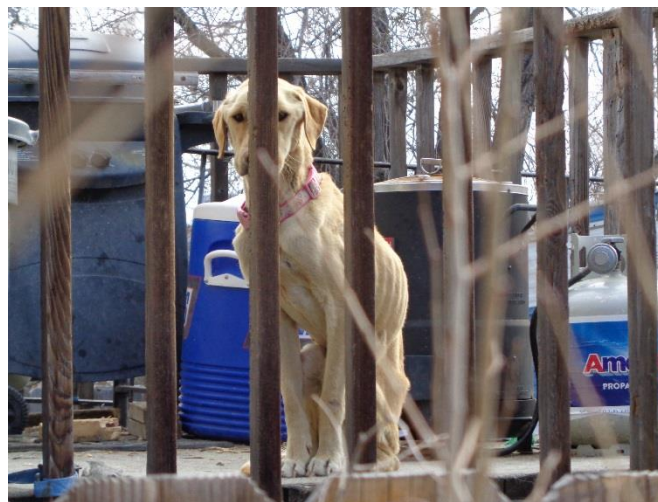

Bite Reporting



- 1018 Reported Dog to human bites in 2016 in Colorado Springs and El Paso County
- 4.1% were severe injuries

- Cats sterilized, vaccinated and returned to colony
- 993 Surgeries
- 151 Active Colonies
- Drop in cat in take since 2010 is 51%

- 105,078 donated hours
- Senior Pets managed 22
- Developed new volunteer positions for the expansion.
