### **Procedural Compliance**

  - Hard copy formal filing provided to City Council
  - Rate Case documents posted on CSU.org website

- July 6, 2017
  - Mailed Legal Notice



#### What is the URR

- The Utilities Rules and Regulations ("URR") set out the regulations, certain fees, and terms and conditions of Utilities' services.
- The URR is organized into a General section, affecting all services, followed by service-specific sections: Electric, Natural Gas, Water, and Wastewater Service.



### Why URR is important

- It is the contract for service between Utilities and each customer
  - Defines legal relationship
  - Place where customer and Utilities find regulations and terms pertinent to the cycle of service



#### Issue

- URR has been revised over several years and comprehensive clean up is timely
  - Sections added at different times to address issues
    - Lacks consistency, continuity and clarity
      - Overlap and redundancy with CSU policies, City Code and Line Extension Standards
    - Flow of document needs improvement
      - Some things are difficult to find because of flow issues
      - Does not line up with cycle of service



#### Background

- Tariff Review Process implemented in 2014
  - Core Team is a cross functional team formed to:
    - Improve process for submitting tariff changes and
    - Review URR and Tariffs
  - Tariff Oversight Committee (TOC) consists of
  - GM's and managers from throughout Utilities to:
    - Review Core Team recommendations and provide organization-wide perspective to changes





#### **URR Revision Process**

- Core Team review and organizational proposals
- Staff feedback sought regarding potential improvements and ease of use of URR
- Organization wide ICQ identified issues, both internal and those presented to staff by customers, to be addressed within URR
- TOC review and support



#### Filing Overview

- Proposing changes to the "General" section of the Utilities Rules and Regulations (URR)
- Designed to enhance flow and readability of the document
   Text moved to follow Utilities "cycle of service"
  - General Section is laid out: (1) Instructions and Definitions, (2) Starting Service, (3) Receiving Service, (4) Ending Service, and (5) Other.
  - All fees moved to fee table



#### **Document Changes**

- Many text changes are needed to enhance flow and readability
- Table mapping changes from old to new tariff was provided with the filing

#### **Examples of Proposed Changes**

 Discontinuance – causes for discontinuance grouped together and more clearly defined





### Examples of Proposed Changes (Cont.)

- Fee table created
  - All fees from General section are now in one place, promoting ease of customer use
  - No change to fee amounts
- Reorganization of Rights of Landlords provisions
  - Combines pre-existing sections dealing with landlords' rights into a single section
  - Benefit to property managers, tenants and Utilities staff
