Lyman Ho, Project Manager, Southern Delivery System (SDS) Land Manager, presented the request for City Council authorization to use eminent domain to acquire interests in real property for the SDS Upper Williams Creek Reservoir. Erin McCauley, Metro Mountain Transit (MMT), explained the project information and the requirements for compliance with the Title VI Program. Ms. McCauley said there had been a robust public involvement process that took place for public input regarding the policies.

Councilmember Geislinger asked if Transit Services expects to expand service further than the Title VI requirements. Brian Vitulli, Transit Planning

Supervisor, said there are multiple planning processes being utilized to improve long range transportation services including the 2040 Transit Plan, the 2045 Transit Plan, and the Mayor's Transportation study. Councilmember Geislinger asked for a future presentation that outlines these additional plans. Mr. Vitulli agreed to provide that information.

Councilmember Avila asked if the Title VI plan is a future plan or is currently in place. Ms. McCauley clarified there is a Title VI plan currently in place.

Citizen Tom Noonan said ridership would improve if service was more reliable and if the citizens felt like they were being heard at the public meetings. Councilmember Avila commented that Metro Mountain Transit has been making efforts to hold the public meetings in several areas of the City.

Dee Dengler, appellant, stated that she would prefer all City Council members to be present for review of this appeal because the outcome could set a precedent for future City Ordinances as well as changes in City Code. Ms. Dengler also stated that when it was presented to City Council last year, the result was a 4-4 tie.

Applicant Paul Rising, Tara Custom Homes, and Duncan Bremer, attorney for the applicant, stated that the decision for the project application has been delayed for over a year. Mr. Bremer stated the original appeal was denied previously by City Council, but the applicant felt that a new full application process instead of just the alley access issue was the right thing to do. Councilmember Murray asked what difficulty would be caused in delaying the hearing two weeks. Mr. Bremer replied that it would be an additional delay, the consultants that had prepared for presentations would have to be rescheduled, as well as the project would be further delayed.

Councilmember Bennett said the full City Council should be involved for public hearings.

Councilmember Geislinger asked if the applicant felt the decision would be affected with a partial Council. Mr. Bremer stated that the postponement is an annoyance.
