### Hi Jennifer,

Thanks for contacting us with your concerns, hopefully I can address some of these for you. In regards to the postcards, the mailing radius is 1,000ft outside of the proposed development (this is across the board, not just in this specific project's case). I checked with staff regarding this project and your home is outside of this radius; there is no malice in this from a city perspective, we just need a stopping point. Sometimes this means that your neighbor would get a postcard, and you would not.

There have not been any meetings regarding this project, however you can view the plans at <a href="https://eoc.springsgov.com/ldrs/rpt/index.htm">https://eoc.springsgov.com/ldrs/rpt/index.htm</a>

Using the file number CPC CM1 17-00141 you can view the drawings and application submitted. There are drawings and photos that show the "monopine" cell tower that is being proposed. This is a "stealth" technology (essentially disguising a tower into its surroundings, in this case it will be a pine tree).

As for your concerns with the potential effects on health, the city is required to follow the protocol established by the FCC (federal communications commission). The FCC is "an independent U.S. government agency overseen by Congress, the Commission is the federal agency responsible for implementing and enforcing America's communications law and regulations." After the FCC passed The Telecommunications Act of 1996 States and local governments, like us, were stripped of our power to oppose the placement of a FCC compliant cell phone tower based on health concerns. (This is how the actual text reads: "No State or local government or instrumentality thereof may regulate the placement, construction, and modification of personal wireless service facilities on the basis of the environmental effects of radio frequency emissions to the extent that such facilities comply with the Commission's regulations concerning such emissions."). Because of this, our hands are tied on any having a response in regards to concerns related to health implications.

Thank you for taking my call before the Thanksgiving holiday.

As I indicated in our phone conversation, Marilynn and I received your notice requesting public comment on the 55 Foot Cell Tower complex application at 1225 N. Circle Drive. Marilynn is a former federal employee with the Soil Conservation Service of the USDA and participated in land use decisions, and we take these matters seriously.

The maps provided and project description showing two large Project Sites seemed to state that two substantial local businesses (Ace Hardware and Cheers Liquor Mart) might be displaced, causing significant disruption of this community neighborhood and loss of potentially 100 to 150 jobs. I spoke to managers at both businesses, who knew nothing about this project, and they seemed very concerned when they read the mailed notice and checked online. Your assurances that the Cell Tower would be located between Ace Hardware and San Miguel Street and not lead to the elimination of these two businesses was reassuring. However this was not in any way communicated by the mailed materials asking for public comment.

Also it did seem suspicious that the applicant's application and request for public comment was sent right before the Thanksgiving holiday when it might be overlooked by the public. It seemed possible that this could be calculated to assure approval without public awareness due to holiday preparations.

It would seem that a more careful communication of this project to the public might have been advantageous, and prevented unnecessary concern.

Please provide feedback to us of the project application process and decisions after our public comments.
