Citizen Jennifer Polk spoke regarding the needs of families in regards to homelessness.

Citizen Lisa Wright spoke about flooding in her home and the City issued hillside grading plan for her property.

Citizen Bill Wysong requested neighborhood covenant and homeowner's association enforcement of short term rentals be documented in the proposed Ordinance. Marc Smith, Corporate Division Chief, Office of the City Attorney, stated the City's zoning code does not supersede a stricter neighborhood covenant.

Citizen Chesley Miller gave a brief history of road dieting within the City.

Citizen JD Elder spoke about his history of skiing, his disability, and about the removal of benches from a local Safeway store.

Citizens Mark Heismann and Rose Porter spoke in opposition of the addition of bicycle lanes.

Citizen Deborah Stout-Meininger spoke in opposition of the proposed I-25 toll road.

Citizen Lawrence Martinez spoke about homelessness in the community.

Citizen Everett Snyder spoke in opposition of road narrowing.

Citizen Scott Anderson stated the City's anti-handout signs are not effective and it is wasteful spending.

President Pro Tem Gaebler stated Amendment 74 is a proposed amendment to the Colorado Constitution which would require the City to award just compensation to owners of private property when a City Ordinance or regulation reduces the fair market value of the property. She stated she, along with the Mayor and forty other jurisdictions, is opposed to Amendment 74.

Councilmember Murray stated he believes if Amendment 74 is passed, it would be to the detriment of the City.

Councilmember Knight requested an amendment be made to the Resolution to include the final vote total. Marc Smith, Corporate Division Chief, Office of the City Attorney, stated the language "This City Council Resolution was passed on a ____- vote." has been added to the Resolution. Councilmember Knight stated voters need to be educated on this item, but he will not be supporting the Resolution.

Councilmember Geislinger said Amendment 74 is too broad reaching and poorly drafted legislation leads to poor consequences. He said it would severely limit Colorado's ability to govern.

President Skorman stated the unintended consequences would cost the City billions of dollars in lawsuits.

Councilmember Pico stated he also opposes Amendment 74 because it is a losing situation for every government body and the taxpayers.

Councilmember Strand stated he is opposed to Amendment 74, but will not be voting in favor of this Resolution because he believes it sets a negative precedence for City Council who is expected to be bipartisan and it could reflect that City Council is being self-protecting.

Citizens Deborah Stout-Meininger and Mark Heismann spoke in opposition to the Resolution.

Motion by Councilmember Murray, seconded by President Pro Tem Gaebler, that the Resolution, as amended with the inclusion of Councilmember vote totals, opposing "Amendment 74", a proposal to amend the Colorado Constitution which would drastically limit state and local government services at a high cost to taxpayers be adopted. Charae McDaniel, Chief Financial Officer, presented the Ordinance for a supplemental appropriation to the General Fund in the amount of \$500,000 for capital and operating expenses associated with increasing the number of available low-barrier shelter beds in the community. She stated as requested by Council, the Ordinance has been amended to include that staff will continue to work towards identifying ongoing operating funding from both internal departments and external agencies for this initiative.

Councilmember Strand asked if the funding could be used for capital improvements. Jeff Greene, Chief of Staff, said part of the funding will be used for ongoing operations and part will be used for capital improvements. Councilmember Strand asked if funding from the Development Review Enterprise could be used. Mr. Greene stated the Development Review Enterprise is similar to the Regional Building Department Enterprise with fees that may be allocated toward the funding which staff will be looking into.

Councilmember Strand asked if there is enough funding available to complete the project by November 2018. Mr. Greene stated they have received a cost estimate from Nunn Construction for the proposed project which is currently being negotiated. He said there has been additional funding received from El Paso County and a private developer.

Councilmembers Pico and Geislinger stated this a step toward addressing the issue of homelessness in the community. Councilmember Knight stated he supports the project being done this year, but does not support the funding coming from the General Fund. He said this should be a loan, not a grant, and other agencies should provide repayment for it.

Motion by Councilmember Murray, seconded by Councilmember Strand, that the Ordinance for the supplemental appropriation to the general fund in the amount of \$500,000 for capital and operating expenses associated with increasing the number of available low-barrier shelter beds in our community be approved on first reading.
