




GOCO Funding Opportunity

- Great Outdoors Colorado invests a portion of Colorado Lottery proceeds to help preserve and enhance the state's parks, trails, wildlife, rivers and open space.
- Eligible entities may submit grant applications on behalf of ineligible organizations.
- Local Park and Outdoor Recreation grants help develop strategic master plans for outdoor parks and recreation projects, trails, or site-specific plans.







Local Park and Outdoor Recreation (LPOR) Grant Application

Government sponsor: City of Colorado Springs

Grant request: \$350,000 LPOR grant

- √\$5 million total project cost
- √\$4.65M raised through private philanthropy by UCCS
- ✓ Support artificial field turf and stadium lights

Application due: November 16, 2016

Grant awarded: April 2017






Community Impact
