- Approval process and public support








...This location has been a significant site for the study of paleontology, with many fossils found now on display at the Smithsonian, Denver Museum of Natural History and Science (DMNS), and the University of Colorado Museum of Natural History. The DMNS recommends ongoing research, preservation of natural outcrops and exposed and buried fossils, and possible creation of guided trails, interpretive signage and even an interpretive center for the Corral Bluffs area.

Current Status:

- TPL seeks continued partnership with the City through the TOPS Program
- TPL obtained appraisal
- TPL agrees to:
 - Acquire the entire property from the Kyle's
 - Sell property to the City for \$570,000, within one phase
 - Share in the cost of due diligence work (title work, phase 1, survey, etc....)





Financial Implications (Acquisition):

• Acquisition: 85.61 acres

- Purchase Price: \$570,000

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Financial Implications (Maintenance and Operations):

- Average cost of maintaining open space at current service levels is \$44 per acre
- Anticipated annual maintenance costs minimal at this time since the property is closed to the public
- TOPS Program will engage in a master plan / management plan process in the future to address
 - Archeological / Paleontological elements (preservation areas vs. public area)
 - Access improvements (trails, trailheads, wayfinding, signage, etc....)
 - Management requirements (weed management, etc....)
- TOPS Open Space Fund can be used for open space access improvements and stewardship (annual budget)
- Corral Bluffs Alliance has committed to continue leading guided hikes
