Summary



Why must the City Reconstruct the Pond?

- November 2016: Complaint filed in Federal District Court by EPA and State of CO (vs. City). The Pond was constructed incorrectly and is "not providing any treatment of storm water prior to discharge".
- April 2016: City notified by State Water Commissioner that facility is currently injuring downstream water rights holders by permanently retaining water.
- Project recently added to approved IGA project list with Pueblo County.

Additional Benefits:

- Reconstructed Pond to provide detention and water quality for all upstream tributary areas using current design standards (Full Spectrum Detention).
- Construction Funding from CDOT (Permanent Water Quality Grant for \$3,148,236).
 SWENT encumbered \$197,200 for engineering as City's match.
- Project supports the City's strategic goal of Investing in Infrastructure and Collaborative Relationships (CDOT).
