Updates from Session 2-Metro Districts



Criteria for which evidence must be presented- satisfactory to Council:

(a) There is sufficient existing and projected need for organized service in the area to be serviced by the proposed special district.

b) The existing service in the area to be served by the proposed special district is inadequate for present and projected needs.

(c) The proposed special district is capable of providing economical and sufficient service to the area within its proposed boundaries.

(d) The area to be included in the proposed special district has, or will have, the financial ability to discharge the proposed indebtedness on a reasonable basis.

- City Council-only hearing process
- Typical process:
 - City Council Budget Committee
 - Work Session
 - Hearing(s)

Most Common Requests



- New or amended metropolitan district service plan
- New BID
- BID inclusion or exclusions
- Authorizations to issue formal debt
- Annual actions on BID plans

GIDs (General Improvement Districts)



- Title 31 Statutory (§ 31-25-601)
- Created by Council Ordinance
- Only in municipalities
- Council acts as Board
- Now authorized to perform maintenance functions
- Available alternative for Colorado Springs developers prior to Metro Districts as an option
- Staff overview document attached


GID Numbers



- 54 Statewide
 - 3 remaining in Colorado Springs
 - Briargate (2000)
 - Marketplace at Austin Bluffs (2005)
 - Spring Creek (1985)
 - at least 6 in Colorado Springs have been dissolved
 - 2 GIDs in Fountain

- SIMD (special improvement maintenance district) conversion option
- New special purpose City district (e.g. storm water in a redevelopment area)
