By way of this letter, the Independence Center (The IC) is expressing support for the Draper Commons project, which is applying for Low Income Housing Tax Credits (LIHTC) from the Colorado Housing and Finance Authority. The IC is delighted to be partnering with BCR Management, Inc., as part of the project will be developed on a 9 acre parcel of land in downtown Colorado Springs. This development is slated to be designed using Universal Design (UD) principles which will allow people with disabilities of all ages to live there easily and independently.
