Health Effects

More deaths are caused each year by tobacco use than by all deaths from HIV, illegal drug use, alcohol use, motor vehicle injuries, suicides, and murders combined.

An Alarming Trend

Nearly 95% of all tobacco users start before the age of 21

At 26.2%, Colorado had the highest rate of youth vaping in the country in 2017 – twice the National average of 13.2%

In 2017, 44% of El Paso County youth had experimented with vaping and 28% were current users

Annually, tobacco related illnesses account for more than 5,100 deaths in Colorado alone

A National Epidemic

- In 2017, 3.6 million students in the US were current e-cigarette users
- In 2018, that number rose to 4.9 million
- As of November 2019, it is over 5.6 million middle and high school students

Nicotine and the Brain

- Brain is still developing until about age 25
- Nicotine is addictive and disrupts the development of the brain circuits that control attention and learning
- Nicotine can also affect the brain's reward system and cause young people's brains to be more easily addicted to other harmful substances













JUUL

• Each pod is equivalent to 1 pack of cigarettes or 200 puffs

 JUUL has become so popular that it has its own verb – JUUL'ing

• In October 2018, JUUL controlled approximately 75% of the market

Vaping Leads to Smoking



- Youth who vape are 4x more likely to smoke cigarettes a year later
- Every day in the US, over 300 kids become daily smokers; onethird of them will eventually die from smoking

Colorado Tobacco Legislation in 2019

- HB 1033 Gave local government's authority to regulate products containing nicotine
- HB 1076 Provided updates to the "Colorado Clean Indoor Air Act", by removing certain exceptions and added electronic smoking devices
