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## Background

- Section 5310 is a federal program designed to fund transportation for older adults and people with disabilities.
  - Formula funding based on population of seniors and people with disabilities in a geographic area.
  - Rural and small urban areas the program is administered by the State DOT
  - ➤ Large urban areas a designated recipient is appointed by the Governor
    - > The City of Colorado Springs has been the designated recipient since 2013
    - > PPACG was designated as of October 1, 2020





#### 5310 Eligible Activities

- Traditional Project Examples:
  - Capital for vehicles and equipment, information technology systems related to transit
  - Mobility management programs
  - Acquisition of transportation services under a contract, lease, or other agreement
- ➤ Non-Traditional Project Examples:
  - > Travel training
  - Volunteer driver programs
  - Building accessible paths to bus stops
  - Improving signage or way-finding
  - Incremental costs of providing same-day service or door-to-door service
  - Vehicles for new accessible taxi, ride-sharing, or vanpooling programs





## **Specialized Transportation**

- ➤ In the past, the City has provided both capital and operating funding to specialized transportation providers
- ➤ Operating funds have been used to provide trips to eligible clients outside the City's ADA-mandated ¾-mile service area or inside the area if the client requires a higher level of service (door-throughdoor, etc.)
- Currently, the City has contracted with four (4) private non-profit agencies to provide these trips





## **Specialized Transportation**

➤ PPACG is home to the Area Agency on Aging (AAA), which administers federal funding to support seniors

➤ Housing both the 5310 program and the AAA program under one agency to leverage funds and create efficiency





#### The Role of the IGA

- ➤ The City of Colorado Springs is committed to ensuring a smooth transition of the specialized transit program to PPACG
  - > Chief goal is to ensure there is no gap in service to current clients
- > PPRTA Funds
  - > \$124,968 in PPRTA funds in 2021, calculated based on 20% of the estimated Federal Fiscal Year 2021 5310 funding apportionment
- Agreement may be extended beyond 2021
  - Amount to be based on HSP trips reported to the National Transit Database (NTD)
