ORDINANCE NO. 21-	
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AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 02-101 CREATING THE CITIZENS' TRANSPORTATION ADVISORY BOARD

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 02-101 created the Citizens' Transportation Advisory Board (CTAB); and

WHEREAS, Council recognizes the need to change the membership of CTAB to more accurately address the City's transportation needs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLORADO SPRINGS:

Section 1. Ordinance No. 02-101 is hereby amended as follows:

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Section 2. Board Members.

- A. The Citizens' Transportation Advisory Board shall consist of 11 regular members representing the four City Council Districts and having an expertise and/or interest in transportation and transportation-related concerns, such as: trails, bicycling and pedestrian issues; neighborhood issues; trucking and freight movement issues; public transit issues; business issues; and land development and construction issues. The Citizens' Advisory Board shall consist of thirteen (13) regular members as follows:
 - a. Six (6) members representing each of the six City Council Districts;
 - b. Three (3) at-large members; and
 - c. One (1) member each to represent the following four (4) special interest groups:
 - i. individuals who ride bicycles for transportation
 - ii. individuals who walk for transportation
 - iii. individuals who ride transit

- iv. individuals who have a disability that impacts their means of transportation.
- B. Board members shall be appointed by the City Council for staggered terms of 3 years. Board members may, at Council's discretion, serve up to 2 consecutive 3 year terms. CTAB members' appointments and terms shall comply with City Code §§ 1.2.901-1.2.907.
- C. In its discretion, City Council may also appoint alternate Board members. Alternate members may participate in discussion of Board matters, but shall not vote upon any matter before the Board, shall not take the place of an absent regular member of the Board and shall not be counted toward a quorum or the number of regular members. Alternate members shall not attend closed legal sessions of the Board. Council may appoint alternates pursuant to City Code § 1.2.902.
- D. In its discretion, City Council may remove any regular or alternate Board member at any time.
- E. **D.** The Board shall adopt and amend rules of procedure for the conduct of its meetings and other business which shall be consistent with the Rules and Procedures of City Council and shall be approved by City Council.
- **E.** With the consent of the City Council and in accord with its rules of procedure, the Board may appoint standing or special committees as needed for the efficient study or analysis of the City's multi-modal transportation system or to conduct public hearings on proposed transportation system operation or policy.
- Section 3. All other provisions of Ordinance No. 02-101 not otherwise amended by this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.
- Section 4. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its final adoption and publication as provided by Charter.
- Section 5. Council deems it appropriate that this ordinance be published by title and summary prepared by the City Clerk and that this ordinance be available for inspection and acquisition in the office of the City Clerk.
