# **11.A.** <u>15-00317</u>

An emergency ordinance amending Ordinance No. 14-101 (2015 Appropriation Ordinance) for a supplemental appropriation to the General Fund in the amount of \$5,000,000 for the response and repair required after the May 2015 heavy rain storms and flooding

Council President Bennett stated this is an emergency ordinance and will be approved with one reading.

Councilmember Knight provided an updated version of the emergency ordinance to Council, reviewed the changes and explained the time-frame for the spending.

Citizen Longinos Gonzalez spoke about the importance of federal disaster relief funds, if received, being used to replenish the emergency reserve fund account.

Motion by Councilmember Knight, seconded by Councilmember Pico, that the emergency ordinance amending Ordinance No. 14-101 (2015 Appropriation Ordinance) for a supplemental appropriation to the General Fund in the amount of \$5,000,000 for the response and repair projects required after the May 2015 heavy rain storms and flooding; with the insertion of "projects" following the word "repair" in the title and after "Public Works" and "Parks" in Section 2 be finally passed. The motion passed by a vote of 9-0-0.

**11.B.** <u>15-00218</u>

A Resolution of the City Council of Colorado Springs, Colorado Approving the 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan, 2015 Action Plan and Citizen Participation Plan for the use of Federal Block Grant Funds (CDBG, HOME, ESG) Provided Through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

Aimee Cox, Manager of Housing and Community Initiatives, provided an overview of the process of bringing these Plans to Council and reviewed the changes made to the Plans based on Council and Citizen feedback.

Councilmember Strand requested the 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan and the 2015 Action Plan be bifurcated from the Citizen Participation Plan. Consensus of Council agreed to the bifurcation.

Councilmember King requested Ms. Cox talk about the changes to the neighborhood leadership development plan funds requested by CONO and the need for affordable housing. Ms. Cox stated CONO has withdrawn their request for funds and discussed efforts to address the affordable housing needs in this community, adding organizations looking to build affordable housing in this community are limited.

Citizen Roger McCarville, Ed Yost and Deborah Stout-Meininger spoke in opposition of the Plan.

Citizens Anne Beer, Zack Andrews, Mike DeGrant, Henry Allen, Langinos Gonzalez and Shawna Kemppainen spoke in support of the Plan.

Citizens Jan Doran and Rick Hoover, Representing CONO, spoke about the importance of funding CONO initiatives.

Councilmember Strand asked for a summary of the data used to determine the areas of need in the community. Ms. Cox provided an overview of the data and index used to determine census tracts and areas of greatest need.

Councilmember Knight expressed concern about the paradigm shift represented by the proposed Plan from the previous Plan and stated he will support the Plan as it provides the opportunity to incorporate changes.

Motion by President Pro Tem Gaebler, seconded by Councilmember Bagley, that the 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan and 2015 Action Plan for the use of Federal Block Grant Funds (CDBG, HOME, ESG) Provided Through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development be approved. The motion passed by a vote of 6-3-0.

Councilmember Strand explained he requested the bifurcation because he does not think citizens were given enough opportunity to contribute to the Citizen Participation Plan and the City could do a better job of soliciting citizen participation.

Councilmember Knight asked if failure to approve the Plan would prevent receipt of funding. Ms. Cox stated the funding would still be available, but that the time to make changes to the Plan is now. Ms. Cox stated the Plan, as presented, meets the HUD citizen input requirements.

Councilmembers stressed the importance of soliciting citizen input and including citizen ideas and responses in the Plan. Ms. Cox agreed to continue her efforts to solicit citizen input and update the Plan accordingly.

Motion by Councilmember Murray, seconded by Councilmember Bagley, that the 2015 Citizen Participation Plan for the use of Federal Block Grant Funds (CDBG, HOME, ESG) Provided Through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development be approved. The motion passed by a vote of 6-3-0.

Ms. Cox also explained her department is working to find programs that may benefit from unused funds, which will be lost if not used.

Motion by President Pro Tem Gaebler, seconded by Councilmember Strand, that the Ordinance amending Ordinance No. 14-101 (2015 Appropriation Ordinance) for a Supplemental Appropriation to the following Federal Entitlement Grants: CDBG (increase by \$220,268), Emergency Solutions Grant (increase by \$58,195), and HOME Investment Partnership (increase by \$173,094) be approved on first reading.
