National Public Works Week (NPWW) is observed during the third week of May every year. By observing NPWW, the American Public Works Association (APWA) seeks to raise the public's awareness of public works issues and call attention to those who are dedicated to improving the quality of life for present and future generations.

The American Public Works Association instituted NPWW as a public education campaign in 1960. In 1960, the United States Senate signed a resolution affirming the first National Public Works Week, and in 1962 President John F. Kennedy signed a Presidential Proclamation. Over the years, scores of resolutions and proclamations from mayors and governors have marked this observance.
