A resolution making certain legislative findings and approving the Project Garnet Urban Renewal Plan.

Summary:

There are two items proposed for Council review and action:

1. A resolution to establish the Project Garnet Urban Renewal Area and Plan. The Plan Area is comprised of one parcel on approximately 88 acres of land plus adjacent right-of-way (ROW). The location of the Plan Area to which this Plan applies is 301 South Rockrimmon Boulevard; and,

2. A tax sharing agreement between the City and the Colorado Springs and Urban Renewal Authority

for funding qualifying public improvements built by the project.

The Council must first vote on the Project Garnet Urban Renewal Area and Plan. If it is approved, the Council may then consider the tax sharing agreement. If the Plan is not approved or final action postponed, then the tax sharing agreement must be either withdrawn or postponed.

Previous Council Action:

There has been no previous City Council action on these properties related to formation of an urban renewal area.

These items are being introduced to Council at the January 23, 2023, City Council Work Session.

Board/Commission Recommendation:

Pursuant the CRS § 31-25-107, the Project Garnet Urban Renewal Plan was reviewed by the Planning Commission on January 11, 2023. The Planning Commission found that the Project Garnet Urban Renewal Plan is consistent with the City's Comprehensive Plan.

The Colorado Springs Urban Renewal Authority Board will be reviewing the conditions survey on January 25, 2023 and the Urban Renewal Plan on January 25, 2023.

Stakeholder Process:

Pursuant to CRS § 31-25-107, a notice must be given to property owners of the conditions survey and potential establishment of an urban renewal area. Arguably, these CRS requirements do not apply given that the proposed urban renewal plan was initiated by the property owner and the property owner has been continually involved in the process. Regardless, to fully comply with CRS, all required notifications have been sent to the property owner throughout the process, including the City Council hearing.

Alternatives:

- 1. Adopt the plan and agreement as presented;
- 2. Adopt the plan and agreement with modifications;
- 3. Deny the plan and agreement; or
- 4. Postpone action for further analysis.

Proposed Motion:

Adopt a resolution making certain legislative findings and approving the Hancock Urban Renewal Plan.
