Proclamation

Juneteenth June 19, 2023

WHEREAS, Juneteenth is the oldest known celebration commemorating the ending of slavery in the United States. Dating back to 1865, it was on

June 19th the Union soldiers, led by Major General Gordon Granger, landed at Galveston, Texas with news the war had ended and the

enslaved were free; and

WHEREAS, Juneteenth, celebrates Black freedom and respect for all cultures. The

origins of the celebration in 1865 are not forgotten, but all of those roots tie back to the fertile soil from which a national day of pride is

growing; and

WHEREAS, Juneteenth's mission is to promote and cultivate knowledge and

appreciation of African American history and culture; and

WHEREAS, Juneteenth has been a positive force in our nation as a whole and

the Colorado Springs Community in particular; and

WHEREAS, local chapters of national organizations like The NAACP and the

Southern Christian Leadership Conference, have long standing relationships in the Pikes Peak Region as trusted leaders fostering

cultural respect and inclusion; and

WHEREAS, following their example, we declare in one voice, we all grow in

respect and appreciation for all of our cultures and differences by

being exposed to one another and working together; and

WHEREAS, this kind of unity, brightens the future for all of us and that is the Spirit of

Juneteenth.

NOW, THEREFORE, The Mayor and City Council of Colorado Springs, do hereby recognize Juneteenth and all community members are asked to join us in celebrating and recognizing the significant and commendable accomplishments of the African American community in the Pikes Peak Region.
