## ORDINANCE NO. 25 -\_\_\_\_

AN ORDINANCE CREATING A NEW SECTION 108 (CARRYING OF A FIREARM IN GOVERNMENT BUILDINGS) OF PART 1 (DANGEROUS AND DEADLY WEAPONS) OF ARTICLE 7 (DANGEROUS WEAPONS AND SUBSTANCES) OF CHAPTER 9 (PUBLIC OFFENSES) OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF COLORADO SPRINGS 2001, AS AMENDED, PERTAINING TO FIREARMS

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLORADO SPRINGS:

Section 1. Section 108 (Carrying of a Firearm in Government Buildings) of Part 1 (Dangerous and Deadly Weapons) of Article 7 (Dangerous Weapons and Substances) of Chapter 9 (Public Offenses) of the Code of the City of Colorado Springs 2001, as amended, is created to read as follows:

## 9.7.108: CARRYING OF A FIREARM IN GOVERNMENT BUILDINGS:

- A. This part and the other ordinances, rules, and regulations of the City provide the provisions for carrying firearms in City government buildings and adjacent parking areas and shall supersede Colorado Revised Statutes §18-12-105.3(1)(B).
- B. This section shall not limit the authority of the Mayor and facility managers to develop security plans or promulgate rules and regulations necessary for the health, safety, security, and welfare of the public, which may regulate carrying firearms in City government buildings and adjacent parking areas.
- Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its final adoption and publication as provided by Charter.
- Section 3. Council deems it appropriate that this ordinance be published by title and summary prepared by the City Clerk and that this ordinance be available for inspection and acquisition in the office of the City Clerk.
