Proclamation

Suicide Prevention Month September 2023

WHEREAS, 194 El Paso County residents died by suicide and thousands of their friends and family were forever changed by these losses last year; and

whereas, in El Paso County in 2022, suicide was the second leading cause of preventable deaths for people of all ages and men accounted for a

disproportionate 74 percent of those deaths; and

whereas, in 2022, suicide by firearm accounted for over 60% of suicide deaths in El Paso County (10% higher than the national average) supporting the idea that with ownership comes responsibility and increased awareness about the safe storage practices for suicide prevention is needed in our community;

and

whereas, although El Paso County has seen a decrease in youth and military suicides over the last year, it remains vitally import to continue suicide prevention efforts with partners throughout the City of Colorado Springs accessing the

strategies that have proven effective with our youth and military, such as increasing access to suicide safer care and increasing our informed public

through providing basic suicide prevention trainings; and

whereas, the Suicide Prevention Collaborative of El Paso County's vision is to reduce

isolation, suicide attempts, and deaths by creating caring communities that are resilient, connected, and capable of supporting every person, regardless

of the struggles they face; and

WHEREAS, a starting point to prevent deaths by suicide is for employers to provide

standardized suicide prevention policies and procedures to all employees;

and

WHEREAS, the Suicide Prevention Collaborative of El Paso County recognizes that

suicide prevention is everyone's business and unites community partners such as the City of Colorado Springs in addressing suicide prevention through trainings, resources, and implementation of the Community Suicide

Prevention and Response Plan; and

WHEREAS, the City of Colorado Springs prioritizes mental health and wellbeing to

prevent suicide and enhance the quality of life of our residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, The Mayor and City Council of Colorado Springs, do hereby recognize September 203 as Suicide Prevention Month in Colorado Springs and applaud the efforts of The Suicide Prevention Collaborative of El Paso County as they strive to make a difference.
