Juneteenth
June 19, 2024

- WHEREAS,** June 19th is declared as Juneteenth Freedom Day, a nationally recognized day which celebrates the rich culture, legacy and heritage of Black and African American people; and
- WHEREAS,** on Juneteenth, we commemorate that day and honor the tireless work of abolitionists who made it their mission to deliver the promise of America for all Americans; and
- WHEREAS,** we celebrate the resilience of the African American Community and the progress we have made together from the abolition of slavery to the Civil Rights movement and beyond, and continue the tireless efforts to overcome systematic injustice; and
- WHEREAS,** we honor the generations of activists to include Ms. Opal Lee affectionally known as the "*Grandmother of Juneteenth*" who was recently awarded the Presidential Medal of Honor for her dedication to ensuring that Juneteenth be recognized as a federal holiday. Ms. Lee at the age of 89 embarked on a 1,400 mile walk from Ft. Worth, Texas to Washington DC to raise awareness and educate on the importance of the Juneteenth holiday. Ms. Lee and others have advanced the need for our Nation to recognize Juneteenth; and
- WHEREAS,** we are committed to the American promise. A promise of freedom, liberty and justice; and our ongoing work to realize that promise for all.
