





HOW PUBLIC PARTICIPATION INFLUENCES THE PLAN



CITIZEN PARTICIPATION PLAN

- Two public hearings before drafting (40 attendees)
- Consultations (37 agencies)
- Survey (75 respondents)
- Draft posted for 30-day review and comment period
- Public hearing to present and take questions on the draft (35 attendees)
- Community Development Advisory Committee (CDAC)
- Other plans (neighborhood plans, City surveys, peer agency planning)
- Email newsletter (620 subscribers)


COMMENTS RECEIVED

- Need more affordable housing
- Dire need for rental assistance currently unavailable for vast majority who need it
- Shelter for families, victims of domestic violence and those with medical needs
- Sustainable solutions for preventing homelessness
- Incentivize density
- Funding for accessory dwelling units
- Public transportation
- Housing help at the new Senior Center
- Share successful projects

Businesses Assisted	23	(460%)
Homelessness Prevention & Shelter	10,295	(68%)
