

ORDINANCE NO. 26-___

AN ORDINANCE CONFIRMING THE MAYOR'S APPOINTMENT OF THE CITY ATTORNEY AND SETTING THE SALARY OF THE CITY ATTORNEY

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLORADO SPRINGS:

Section 1. City Council confirms the Mayor's appointment of Stefanie Boster as the City Attorney for the City of Colorado Springs by a concurring vote of a majority of the members of City Council.

Section 2. Stefanie Boster shall fulfill the duties and responsibilities of the City Attorney as set forth in the City Charter § 13-80, City Code Ch. I, Art. 2, Part 4, and other applicable laws, rules or regulations.

Section 3. In compliance with City Charter § 13-80, City Attorney Stefanie Boster's annual salary for 2026 and thereafter until and unless amended by Council shall be set at \$275,000.

Section 4. The effective date of Stefanie Boster's confirmation as City Attorney shall be May 12, 2026.

Section 5. This ordinance supersedes all prior ordinances setting the salary of the City Attorney that are inconsistent herewith.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its final adoption and publication as provided by Charter.

Section 7. Council deems it appropriate that this Ordinance be published by title and summary prepared by the City Clerk and that this Ordinance be available for inspection and acquisition in the office of the City Clerk.
