Expanded access to care

Interquest Medical Center

- Opened May 2023
- Orthopedic and primary care clinics, along with lab, rehab, and comprehensive imaging services

Eastview Medical Center

- Opened October 3, 2023
- Offers outpatient imaging, outpatient rehab, lab and pre-admissions testing, breast imaging, an ambulatory surgery center and multi-specialty orthopedics, urology, women's care, breast surgery, primary care, and ENT clinics

Our commitment to behavioral health

Integrated primary and behavioral health care

Comprehensive care in one location.



UCHealth is investing more than \$150M in behavioral health, the largest and most comprehensive investment in the region



Behavioral Health Connect (BHCON) co-responder program

- Partnership with local government agencies including El Paso County Sheriff's Office, Fountain Police Department, and Manitou Police Department
- Pairs a licensed behavioral health clinician with law enforcement for a coordinated response to behavioral health-related emergency calls
- Aims to prevent unnecessary hospitalization and/or incarceration of individuals with behavioral health needs
- Facilitates crisis intervention and other behavioral health-related trainings for local law enforcement agencies
- Provides follow-up communication to support access to resources and the continuum of care

Supporting our veterans and armed forces

- Lead agency in "Next Chapter" program providing services for Veteran Suicide Prevention pilot program¹
- Signed formal training agreement with the Defense Health Agency's Colorado Military Health System to increase training opportunities for military health care personnel to develop or maintain vital high acuity clinical skills²
- Expanded training agreements with U.S. Air Force, Evans Army Community Hospital, and Army Special Forces
- Developing an outpatient program to support service members and veterans with high-risk behavioral health needs
- Dedicated efforts to recruit military members and spouses, including the development of a Military Spouse and Significant Other Committee³
- Established Military Friendly Committee focused on support for employed military members and families

Forensic Center of Excellence (FCOE)

- Opened first fully in-house Forensic Nurse Examiner program in Colorado April 2023
- Supports patients who have experienced sexual assault, intimate partner violence, and assaults like strangulation
- Funded by a \$2.8M grant through the Office of Victims of Crime
- The first and only hospital-based FCOE in the world
 - o 5 complete exam rooms
 - o State-of-the-art telehealth office
 - Fully-outfitted conference room for educational offerings



2019 – launched the first telehealth program for sexual assault patients in rural communities 2021 – partnered with Safe Passage to create the first and only co-located Child Advocacy Center in Colorado



Vision for southern Colorado

Primary Care

- Opening three new primary care locations to address the primary care shortage
- Locations include Interquest Medical Center, Fountain, and Black Forest

Memorial Hospital Central

- Adding 40 beds to Memorial Hospital Central; expected to open in Winter 2023
- Continue to develop as a specialized, regional medical center by investing in sub-specialized services such as surgical oncology and cardiac surgery



Mobile Stroke Treatment Unit (MSTU)

- Unit was among only three in the nation when it went into service in Colorado Springs in 2016
 - MSTU study published in the New England Journal of Medicine (2021) showed patients treated in MSTUs are 2.5x more likely to have good outcomes
- Colorado Springs to have a dedicated UCHealth MSTU
 - o January 2024
 - Over \$731,000 raised so far
